ICS TV a future-oriented step: Imran Masood

two-day workshop on 'Education for All' was arranged by Institute of Communication Studies (ICS) in collaboration with the UNESCO and the Punjab Literary and Non-Formal Basic Education Department.


preserve their culture and heritage.

Media should play a more responsible role: Sheikh Rasheed

The media in Pakistan is free but should play a more responsible role and depict reality without bias, Sheikh Rasheed former Federal Minister for Information and Broadcasting said at a seminar titled "Press Freedom in Pakistan" held in connection with the World Press Freedom Day, organized jointly by the Punjab University Institute of Communication Studies (ICS) and UNESCO.

The Federal Minister pointed out that the media in Pakistan was free and more television channels are being issued licenses, soon there might be up to seven hundred television channels in the country. He further said that good journalism did not imply to just write against the government. "You can get very good news by maintaining good relations with the government and its people and it should be kept in mind that many journalists became big because of good government reporting", said the Minister.

The Minister said that Indian newspapers were willing to distribute their papers for free in Pakistan but the Pakistani government did not allow it, as it may harm the local newspaper industry.

Sheikh Rasheed supported the 7th Wage



Board Award and said that government was sincere in its efforts but newspaper-owners were creating hindrances. The minister said that the latest legislation on PEMRA could be amended if there were a provision allowing electronic media people to be arrested without warrants.

The seminar also marked the end of the two-day workshop on 'Education for all' that was organized by (ICS) in its premises. The Minister distributed certificates amongst the workshop participants and awarded the Gender Issues Reporting Awards, to Fozia Shahid and Huma Yousuf, organized by UNESCO and Pakistan Press Foundation. Guest of Honour Moahid Hussain, Prof Dr. Mughees-ud-Din Sheikh, Adnan Shahid and Atta-ur-Rehman also spoke on the occasion.

ICS stages grand 'Media Assembly' on October 8 earthquake

media assembly titled "Earthquake Catastrophe and Media" was organised by the Institute of Communication Studies (ICS). Eminent media personnel from cross-section of electronic and print media were invited, along with the heads of the department of Mass Communication from other universities to contribute towards the formulation of proposals to enhance the role of media in crises management.

Participants stressed on the need to create awareness and provide training to cope with natural disasters to minimize the loss of life and property. The assembly urged that awareness-building is imperative next to induction of new courses on coverage and management in Communication Studies.

The Director Prof Dr. Mughees-ud-Din Sheikh said that this media assembly was an essential platform of discussion and the Institute would make arrangements to organize such events at least once every year on different issues. He said while the media was busy updating the masses on the effects and aftermath of the earthquake the Institute's radio station at Muzaffarabad was making undaunted and earnest efforts to highlight health and education issues, which were the immediate necessity of that time.

The assembly observed that some channels did not show ethical principles and standards

by showing footage of corpses and injured persons, leaving a negative impression on the viewers. Participants maintained that the media, especially the electronic media should maintain a rating and censor standard. However, the media's role in covering the catastrophe was appreciated which lead to the government's swift rescue operations in the affected areas.

Eminent media personnel Mr. Mujeeb-ur-Rehman Shami, Mr. Salim Bokhari, Mr. Rizwan Mumtaz Ali, Mr. Zia-ur-Rehman Amjad, Mr. Khawar Naeem Hashmi, Dr. Awais, Mr. Israr Kisana, heads of the department of Mass Communication of various colleges and universities of Lahore were the active participants of the assembly.

Advisor to CM, Dr. Faiza Asghar calls to eradicate child beggary

Delivering a lecture, 'Destitute Children and Our Responsibilities', hosted by the Institute of Communication Studies (ICS), Dr. Faiza Asghar, Advisor to the Punjab Chief Minister on Children Rights and Chairperson of the Child Protection and Welfare Bureau, said that Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) and individuals both should be urged to do their part in curbing child begging and exploitation of child rights by giving them protection and basic necessities of life.

Statistics given by Dr. Faiza revealed that around 30,000 to 40,000 children were forced to beg on the roads. And 6000 of these children were suffering from sexual exploitation for a mere Rs 10 to 25, with around sixteen begging mafia gangs operational in the city.

She said that poverty is one of the main reasons contributing to the increase in child beggars. Another factor being drug addict heads of families forcing their children to beg instead of providing them education.

She further said that child protection institutes, units and special courts were working under the Bureau to combat this social menace; adding that around 322 operations had been conducted for eliminating the miseries besides taking 1836 children in custody. The Bureau provides food, education, medical and vocational facilities for physical and moral support of the children.

Addressing the audience on the occasion, the Director ICS Prof Dr. Mughees-ud-Din Sheikh said all segments of the society should be urged to help the forlorn children.



Reuters' Editor appreciates the aptitude of female students at ICS

Anaging Editor and Head of Editorial Operations of Reuters, Mr. Chaitanya Kalbag Bio visited Institute of Communication Studies (ICS) to deliver a special lecture. The Director of the Institute, Prof Dr. Mughees-ud-Din Sheikh gave a welcome note in his honor.

Mr. Chaitanya briefed the students on the history of Reuters, describing the series of developmental changes Reuters went through since the time of its establishment. He also talked about the setup of Reuters, its policies, and its globally functional operating units. Warning the students about the dangers of the field of journalism he said that risk surrounds the lives of journalists; and they should always be prepared to face adverse conditions. He said that no story is as important as life itself.

FM 104.6 interviewed Mr. Chaitanya who appreciated the Program Manager Zahid Bilal and the staff members of FM 104.6 for their high quality productions. He was greatly impressed by the number of female students currently studying at the Institute and their outstanding aptitude and intellect.

renders rehabilitative communication services in

Muzaffarabad

Institute of Communication Studies (ICS) developed a unique way of offering rehabilitation to the victims of the October 8 earthquake in the form of 'Rehabilitative Communication'.

On December 10, 2005 the Institute launched FM 104.6 in Muzaffarabad to provide information and advice on health, sanitation, education, child protection, relief schedule, to the quake survivors in Muzaffarabad. FM 104.6 was being run by its broadcasters from a tent pegged in Upper Chatter. The team included seven broadcast staff members and three university students. Replacement teams were ready on cue to ensure easy substitution and smoothness in the operation of the channel.

Recorded and live programmes were broadcasted from 9am to 9pm, including talk shows aimed at discussing the post quake scenario. The programmes covered a wide range of topics to assist the victims and provide them the strength the courage to rebuild their lives. Two news bulletins were aired in regional languages as well as Urdu during the 12-hour transmission.

'Sathi hath barhana', 'Hum aik hain', 'Khaima baithak' were among the programs aired to help the survivors psychologically.

PU in collaboration with WHO and UNICEF distributed 500 transistors in the quake-hit areas to restore the communication.

The launch of the channel was attended by Vice Chancellor Lt-Gen (R) Arshad Mahmood, Chairman of the National Volunteers' Movement Muhammad Ali Durrani and a representative of the AJK President. Director ICS Prof Dr. Mughees-ud-Din Sheikh said the prime objective of establishing a radio station is to educate affectees about the health care facilities. The radio transmitter functioning there has been built by the students of the Institute.

Launch of FM 104.6 at Muzaffarabad did not affect the transmission of Institute's FM station at Lahore. The efforts of the station have been applauded and acknowledged by the leading media organizations of the world like BBC World, Voice of America, Voice of Germany, NHK World Japan, "News Day" New York and Radio Holland along with the leading domestic media organizations.
