Foreword

The brief fact book on the University of the Punjab (PU) will give the reader all basic facts and figures pertaining to PU in 2013. I would like to thank Prof. Dr. Mansoor Sarwar for his thought and effort in preparing this booklet, which was conceived by the two of us together. I would also like to thank Engr. Tariq Majid Qureshi, Rao Muhammad Sharif and Dr. Kamran Abid for their contribution to this fact book.

As the reader will notice, certain basic parameters, which indicate the performance of a university, have improved steadily and very significantly since January 2008 when the present administration assumed charge. The number of research publications in journals carrying an impact-factor has more than tripled from 162 in 2007 to 520 in 2013. Publications in HEC recognized journals are in addition to these. Furthermore, for the consecutive 2nd year in the history of the university, the total number of publications in journals and conferences has crossed 1000. The number of books published by PU faculty members in the period 2008 to 2013 is 402, i.e., an average of about 67 per year. In 2007, this number stood at only 27.

Research funding has been increased from Rs 4 million in 2007-2008 to Rs 100 million in 2013-14. A research endowment fund (started with 250 M in 2010) currently at Rs 400 million exists in addition to this research funding. Funds for Faculty Development have been enhanced from Rs 45 million in 2007-2008 to Rs 100

million in 2013-14. This is in addition to HEC funded Faculty Development program. Under the two programs over 100 faculty members have been sent abroad for PhD studies and many of them have returned in the past two or three years, adding to the pool of PhDs in PU. An endowment of Rs 20 million for the welfare of employees has also been setup. The investment of PU has risen from Rs 1.85 billion in June 2008 to Rs 4 billion in December, 2013.

For the first time in PU history, the full—time faculty strength crossed the landmark number of 1000. The PhD to non-PhD teacher ratio has also increased by almost 15% for regular faculty members since 2008, jumping from 29% for regular faculty members at the end of 2007 to 43.91% in 2013. PhD production has suddenly risen from an average of 41 per annum during 1990-2007 to 144 per annum during the period 2008 to 2013. In 2012 the Punjab University produced 206 PhDs, becoming the first ever university in the history of Pakistan to produce more than 200 PhDs in one year. The percentage of MS/MPhil and PhD students at the university has increased from 5.66% in 2011 to 8.14% in 2013.

Students were appropriately funded for the needy & merit scholarships. In 2013, more than 27% regular full-time students were given scholarships. We received Rs. 104 (M) as fees from students and disbursed scholarships worth Rs. 76 (M) amongst these students from the income of the University of the Punjab.

The HEC has provided scholarships worth Rs. 19.27 (M) and Government of the Punjab has also provided scholarships worth Rs. 14.15 (M) approximately.

Our students have performed extremely well in all kinds of cocurricular activities in previous years as will be seen from various tables. Regular convocations on yearly basis have been restored after four decades. The institution of Professor Emeritus has been revived after a decade and a half, a revival that has been applauded by intellectual circles of the country. The academic atmosphere has been restored after decades.

At the end of the booklet we have a list of FAQ's and answers. It is hoped that this fact book, the third one ever published by the University of the Punjab, will be of use to anyone seeking information about Punjab University at a glance.






