## RULES OF ENDOWMENTS<sup>1</sup>

The Syndicate has laid down the following principles to be observed in the award of prizes, [medals]<sup>2</sup> and scholarships given from the special Endowed Trust Fund: -

- (a) The award be made on the result of the Pass Papers excluding Honours Papers unless in the terms of the award Honours Papers are specially included. The fact of taking up Honours Papers does not exclude the candidate from the award if on the Pass Papers taken in the subject he takes the highest place.
- (b) The marks in additional subject should be added if the additional optional subject is taken, but if a candidate can earn sufficient marks on the Pass Papers to beat the next man even though he took an additional subject, the award would be his.  
  
Marks in the additional subject may not be added unless the candidate passes in it.
- (c) Prizes, medals and scholarships shall be awarded only to those candidates who take the examination as a whole and at the time of the annual examination. A candidate taking the whole examination at the time of the Supplementary Examination or partly at the Annual and partly at the Supplementary Examination is not entitled to the award.
- (d) A candidate who appears in one subject only is not entitled to the award even though the award may be for that subject.
- (e) In the case of examinations held twice a year in certain Faculties, the award should be made to the candidate who passes highest in the annual examination (e.g., in the examinations held in May/June for the 1st Professional (Parts I & II), 2nd Professional and Final Professional M.B., B.S. Examination); the candidate who takes the examination in parts shall not be entitled to the award.
- (f) An award for a single subject should only be made to a candidate who is successful in the examination as a whole.
- (g) Opinion of the Principal concerned should be invited as to whether, for the award of the medal or prize intended for his College only, the marks in the Honours Papers should be included or not. The opinions received should be submitted to the Syndicate for final orders. The decision arrived at should be permanent and not variable from year to year.

### 1. **Sir McLeod Medal and Purse for Arabic:**

The Medal and Purse are given to the candidate who stands first in Arabic in the Master of Arts Annual examination of the University of the Punjab.

**2. Sir McLeod Medal and Purse for Sanskrit:**

The Medal and Purse are given to the candidate who stands first in Sanskrit or Persian in the Master of Arts Examination of the University of the Punjab.

**3. [ Fuller Exhibition: ]<sup>1</sup>**

The Scholarship is given to the student of any of the Colleges affiliated to the University of the Punjab who obtains the highest place in the B.A. Examination of the Punjab University and continues his studies for the next higher examination.

In determining the award the marks obtained in additional optional papers shall be counted.

**4. Amritsar McLeod Memorial Scholarship:**

This scholarship should be awarded to a student standing first in the Intermediate (12th Class) Examination from amongst the students appearing in the Intermediate examination either through an affiliated College situated in Lahore district or as a private candidate subject to the condition that the candidate takes admission in the B.A./B.Sc. Class in any affiliated College or joins a professional College.

The value of the scholarship is Rs. 16.00 per mensem and is awarded every second year.

**5. Alwar Gold Medal:**

This medal is awarded to the candidate who has obtained the highest number of marks in Sanskrit and English in the Pass Papers taken together in the B.A. Examination. But according to the conditions for the award of the Medal it should be given to the best student in both English and Sanskrit during the year, vide page 42 of the Trust Report. If, however, no student offers Sanskrit, the Medal should be awarded to the student securing the highest number of marks in Arabic and English.

**6. Arnold Silver Medal:**

This medal is awarded to the best pass in the B.A. Examination including the additional optional paper.

This Medal is annually sent to this office by the Director of Education, Lahore Region, Lahore.

1. The Syndicate on 10th November, 1944, para 1, ruled that a scholarship for Fuller Exhibition can only be held by a candidate who stands first in the B.A. Examination and would lapse in case it is not availed of by that candidate. The award of this scholarship could not act as a bar to the award of any other scholarship to which the Fuller Exhibitioner may otherwise be entitled.

**7. Arnold Gold Medal:**

This medal is awarded annually by rotation to the best pass in the M.A. in Languages, History, Political Economy, and Mental and Moral Philosophy. If the best pass in the subject, in which the medal is to be awarded for the year, is in Third Class, then the award is to be made to the eligible candidate in the next subject (vide paragraph 5 of the Syndicate Proceedings, dated 9th June, 1923).

**8. Rai Bahadur Lala Sagar Chand Medal:**

This medal is awarded to the candidate who passes the B.A. Examination and obtains the highest total number of marks in both the courses of Mathematics (pure and applied) in the B.A. Pass Examination, vide paras 20 and 15 of the Syndicate Proceedings, dated the 21st January, 1902 and 25th May, 1937, respectively.

**9. Aitchison-Ram Rattan Sanskrit Scholarship:**

One scholarship is awarded to the best pass in the B.A. Examination in Sanskrit, and the other to the best pass in Sanskrit in the Intermediate Examination, vide paragraph 4 of the Senate, dated the 23rd July, 1888. Provided that if there is no candidate offering Sanskrit, the scholarships shall be awarded to the best pass in Arabic and Persian in the B.A. Examination.

**10. Jind Punjabi Scholarships:**

These Scholarships are awarded by the Principal, Oriental College to the Students of the Punjabi Class.

**11. Patiala Gurmukhi Scholarships:**

These scholarships are awarded by the Principal to any deserving students, on rolls of the oriental college at time discretion.

**12. Wakefield Memorial Scholarship:**

The total income from this endowment may be given annually in lumpsum to one or two needy brilliant students on rolls of a University Teaching Department by the standing scholarship committee. The Assistant Treasurer shall annually invite applications for the purpose at the beginning of the academic session.

**13. Bahawalpur Arabic Scholarship:**

The Principal, Oriental College, Lahore shall award this scholarship, to a student of the Maulvi Fazil class who secures the highest number of marks in the first house examination held in the College. When unavailed of this is automatically transferred to supplement the McLeod Punjab Arabic Studentship, vide para 5 of the Senate Proceedings, dated the 16th June, 1922, and para 1 of the Academic Council Proceedings, dated the 4th November, 1936.

**14. Patiala-Sime Gold Medal:**

This medal is awarded to the candidate who, while passing the Examination for Bachelor of Arts of the Punjab University in all the subjects (it being not necessary for the candidate to either appear in or pass in the additional optional paper), obtains the highest number of marks in English vide para 7 of the Syndicate Proceedings, dated the 27th May, 1890, and paragraph 18 and 15 of the Syndicate Proceedings, dated the 16th December, 1932, and 25th May, 1937, respectively.

**15. F.S. Jamaluddin Medal:**

This medal is awarded to the best pass in M.A. Examination in Arabic, and in case there is no candidate in the M.A. Examination, the medal is given to the best pass in the B.A. Examination including the marks in the additional papers (if any, and provided the candidate passes in it) vide paras 10 and 15 of the Syndicate Proceedings, dated the 8th June, 1891 and 25th May, 1937 respectively.

**16. Khalifa Muhammad Hassan Jubilee Medal:**

This medal shall be awarded to the best pass in the B.A. Examination subject to the condition that the student should have offered Arabic as one of the subjects for the B.A. Examination.

**17. Khalifa Muhammad Hassan-Aitchison Medal:**

This medal is awarded to the best pass in Arabic for the M.A. Examination and in case there be no candidate for the M.A. Examination, the medal is given to the best pass in the B.A. Examination, vide page 44 of the Trust Report.

**18. Inayat Ali Griffin Prize:**

This prize shall be given to a successful candidate of the [LL.B Part-II]<sup>1</sup> Examination who is reported by the examiner to have secured the highest number of marks in [Islamic Law]<sup>2</sup> portion of the relevant paper.

**19. Inayat Ali Watson Silver Medal:**

The condition for the award of the medal is that it should be given to the student who stands highest in Economics in the M.A. Examination and that failing a candidate in Economics in the M.A. Examination, the medal should be given to the best pass in Economics in the B.A. Examination.

**20. Jaishi Ram Gold Medal:**

The medal is awarded to the best pass in the [L.L.B. Part-I Examination]<sup>3</sup>

- 21. Rai Sahib Munshi Gulab Singh Denzil Ibbetson Diamond Jubilee Purse:**
- This purse is given to the best pass in the M.A Examination in English vide para 7 of the Syndicate Proceedings, dated the 21st January, 1898.
- 22. K. B. Sheikh Nanak Bakhsh Medal:**
- This medal is awarded to the candidate who stands highest in the M.A. Examination in Philosophy and in case there is no candidate taking up Philosophy in the M.A. Examination, the medal is awarded to the best pass in the B.A. Examination in the subject of Philosophy, vide para 11 of the Syndicate Proceedings, dated the 24th March, 1898.
- 23. Prince Albert Victor Patiala Scholarships:**
- These scholarships be awarded by the University Scholarship Committee, to any student of good family in straitened circumstances on rolls of B.A. (Honours) or M.A./M.Sc. Classes in the University.
- 24. Nabha Gurmukhi Scholarship:**
- The scholarship may be awarded by the Principal, Oriental College, to any student on the rolls of the College at his discretion.
- 25. Arnold Silver Medal:**
- This medal is awarded to the student who obtains the highest number of marks in Persian in the B.A. Examination from the students of the Government College, Lahore.
- 26. Sir Harnam Singh Rivaz Gold Medal:**
- This medal is awarded to the student who obtains the highest number of marks in English in B.A. Examination from among the student of the F.C. College, Lahore.
- 27. Doctor Rahim Medal:**
- This medal is awarded to the best pass in the M.B.,B.S. Examination held in May/June, but only those candidates are eligible for the award who pass the examination at one time as a whole and not in parts.
- 28. Rivaz Mela Ram Medal:**
- This medal is awarded to the best pass in the B.Ed. Examination.
- 29. Dr. Bishan Das Medal:**
- This medal is awarded to the 2nd best pass in the final M.B., B.S. Examination held in May/June, but only those candidates are eligible for the award who pass the Examination at one time as a whole and not in parts.

**30. Minto Inam Ali Trophy for Marksmanship:**

The endowment was originally intended for a medal to be awarded to the student judged to be the best all-round horse rider on the occasions of sports tournaments.

In 1924, the sale proceeds of the endowment fund were, with the consent of the donor, invested in a permanent trophy to be awarded annually for marksmanship on the occasion of the annual prize distribution of the sports tournament committee. A competition shall be organized by the Secretary, Punjab University Sports Tournament Committee annually.

**31. Diwan Bahadur Baghwan Das Bullo Mal Gold Medal:**

This medal is awarded to the candidate who obtains the highest place in Sanskrit in the B.A. Examination. Provided that if no candidate offers Sanskrit, the Medal may be awarded to the student securing the highest number of marks in Urdu in B.A. (Pass), Examination.

**32. Honourable Sir Rambir Singh Gold Medal:**

This Gold Medal is awarded to the student who stands first in the LL.B [Part-III]<sup>1</sup> Examination.

**33. Mehta Chuni Lal-Gordon Young Medal:**

This medal is awarded to a student for standing first in English and History in the B.A., Examination from amongst the students of the F.C. College, Lahore.

**34. Mehta Chuni Lal Popham Young Medal:**

This medal is awarded to a student for standing first in Sanskrit in the B.A., Examination from among the students of the Government College, Lahore. Provided that if no candidate offers Sanskrit the medal may be awarded to the student securing the highest number of marks in Urdu.

**35. Mehta Chuni Lal-P.J. Fagan Medal:**

This medal is awarded to a student for standing first in Sanskrit in the B.A. Examination from among the students of the Dyal Singh College, Lahore. Provided that if no candidate offers Sanskrit, the Medal may be awarded to the student securing the highest number of marks in Urdu.

**36. The Oman Prize:**

To be given in succession to the candidate who takes up any of the following Sciences:-

Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Geology.

1. Syndicate, dated, 7-12-1996.

The Prize is to be awarded on the result of the Honours Schools for the subject named, viz., Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Geology in which honours schools exist. In case of Geology the prize is to be awarded on the result of final year B.Sc. Examination (Honours). Provided that from the Examination to be held in 1964 the prize shall be awarded on the results of the B.Sc. Honours Examination.

**37. The Dane-Malerkotla Medal and the Dane-Malerkotla Scholarship:**

The Gold Medal to be given every year to the candidate who stands highest in the aggregate in the B.A. Examination and takes Arabic as a subject. The marks in the additional optional paper are to be included.

The Scholarship (of Rs. 15.00 a month) to be given annually to the final year student standing first in the Class Examination of the 4th year in the K.E. Medical College, Lahore.

**38. Nasir-ud-Din-O'Dwyer Medal:**

This medal is awarded to the best pass in M.A. Persian.

**39. [Quaid-i-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah]<sup>1</sup>**

This prize is awarded annually to the best speaker in a declamation contest open to students of the University (for detailed rules, see paragraph 6 of the Syndicate Proceedings, dated the 26th April, 1935).

**40. Lady Dane Gold Medal:**

The medal is awarded annually to a girl who is a native of the Punjab and has passed the B.A. Examination of the year either with Hindi or Sanskrit as her second language, provided that if no girl offers Hindi or Sanskrit the medal shall be awarded to the student who secures the highest number of marks in the B.A. Examination and has offered Urdu or Persian as one of her elective subjects (no girl may receive the medal twice).

**41. Sir P.C. Chatterji Sizeships:**

Lady Basanta Kumari Chatterji presented, in 1937, Rs. 5,000/- in 3% Government promissory notes for an endowment, to be named after her husband, the late Sir P.C. Chatterji, for expending the interest occurring therefrom on founding two Sizeships for scholars in the Oriental College, Lahore, taking a course in the classical oriental languages. They are awarded by the Principal, Oriental College, are tenable for four years at the most, and may be held with a scholarship or a stipend. The annual value of the Sizeships is Rs. 75/-.

- 42. Sir Ganga Ram Medal:**  
Mr. Balak Ram, Barrister-at-Law, presented, in 1928, Rs. 5,000/- in Government paper of 3-1/3% per annum for the purpose of awarding Gold Medal, to be named after his father (Sir Ganga Ram Medal) to the person taking the highest place in the Bachelor of Commerce Examination from the Hailey College of Commerce on the College Foundation Day to be celebrated annually. The balance of the interest on the securities after defraying the cost of the Medal is to be annually spent in a manner to be determined by the Hailey College Committee<sup>\*</sup>
- 43. Amrit Lal Roy Gold Medal:**  
Rai Bahadur Lala Amar Nath presented in 1928, Rs. 1,200/- in 5% War Loan of 1929 for endowing the Gold Medal to be awarded to a candidate who obtains the highest number of marks in English and Sanskrit taken together in the B.A. Examination, provided that if no one offers Sanskrit the Medal should be awarded to the student who obtains the highest number of marks in English and Arabic in the B.A. Examination.
- 44. deMontmorency Gulab Singh Medal:**  
Rai Sahib Lala Sohan Lal of Rai Sahib M. Gulab Singh and Sons, presented in 1930, Rs. 1,700/- (Rs. 300/- as the cost of a die and Rs. 1,400/- as permanent endowment fund in cash) for endowing the Gold Medal to be awarded to a candidate who stands first in the Bachelor of Commerce Examination.
- 45. deMontmorency Thanksgiving Fund Stipends:**  
The University started a thanks - giving fund in 1931 as a mark of condemnation of the attempt on the life of His Excellency the Chancellor and thankfulness at his providential escape. A sum of Rs. 2,479/50 was collected which was placed at the disposal of His Excellency the Chancellor for such disposal as he may be pleased to decide. In accordance with His Excellency's wishes two stipends of Rs. 5/- each for 12 months are annually granted from this fund to poor students in the Oriental College studying Punjabi.
- 46. Diwan Bahadur K.B. Thapar Gold Medal:**  
This medal is awarded annually to the student who stands first in the M.A. Examination in Political Science. The amount of Rs. 2,000/- for this purpose was donated by Major D.R. Thapar, I.M.S., to commemorate the memory of his father Diwan Bahadur K.B. Thapar, R.B., O.B.E.
- 47. Shirimati Damyanti Sachdeva Declamation Prizes:**  
These prizes are awarded annually to two students who are adjudged to be the best speakers in Hindi in the University, provided that if it is not possible to hold a declamation contest in Hindi the Prizes may be awarded to the two students who are adjudged to be the best speakers in Urdu in the University. A declamation contest shall be held by the University every year. One of the two prizes being reserved for girl students and the other being open for the students of the University both male and female.

\*. The Hailey College of Commerce Committee has decided that the balance of Rs. 100 be utilized in the award of a scholarship of Rs. 10/- p.m. for ten months, to be awarded to a deserving student in the first year Class by the College Committee on the recommendations of the Principal. Syndicate Proceedings dated 15th June, 1928.

**48. Principal Seshadri Prize:**

This prize is awarded at the convocation to a student who stands first in English in the B.A. Examination. The prize is to consist of books on English Literature, the books to be approved by the Vice-Chancellor. A sum of Rs. 1,050.00 was given in the year 1940 by Principal P. Seshadri, M.A. Government College, Ajmer for utilizing the interest thereof for the prize. (Paragraph 13 of the Syndicate Proceedings, dated 4th June, 1940).

**49. Maulvi Abdul Haque Urdu Declamation Medal:**

This medal is awarded annually at the University Convocation to the best speaker in Urdu from among the students of the Colleges affiliated to the Punjab University. A sum of Rs. 1,500/- was donated in 1942 by Dr. Muhammad Iqbal, M.A., Ph.D., University Professor of Persian, Oriental College, Lahore, for utilizing the interest thereof for this Medal.

The medal is named after Dr. Maulvi Abdul Haque, B.A. D.Litt. Honorary Secretary of the Anjuman-e-Taraqqi-e-Urdu.

**50. Doctor Partap Sing Harbans Singh Khosla Scholarship:**

This Scholarship is awarded annually to a Graduate in the Chemistry Honours Schools proceeding to work for M.Sc. Chemistry on Research, who stands highest in the Examination amongst those who had not been awarded either of the two University Scholarships. The value of the Scholarship is Rs. 25/- per mensem. The amount of Rs. 8,000/- for this purpose was donated in 1942 by S. Mul Singh Khosla, Ex-State Secretary, Jammu and Kashmir, and member, Praja Sabha, Jammu.

**51. Charles Earl Bevan Petman Law Prize:**

This prize is awarded annually either in cash or in the shape of Law Books to a Law student who obtains the highest marks in criminal Law. A sum of Rs. 1,000/- for this purpose was donated by Mrs. Amy Bevan Petman to commemorate the memory of her husband, Mr. Charles Earl Bevan Petman (vide paragraph 12 of the Syndicate Proceedings, dated 8th January, 1943).

**52. [Quaid-I-Millat, Liaqat Ali Khan]<sup>1</sup>**

A prize of Rs.25/- (in cash) is awarded annually to each of the best speaker in a Declamation Contest open to students of affiliated Colleges. The amount of Rs.2,000/- for this purpose was donated in 1946 by Professor Sant Ram Grover, M.A., Dyal Singh College, Lahore, to commemorate the memory of his son Mr. Krishan Kishore Grover, (For detailed rules see paragraphs 48 and 8 of the Syndicate Proceedings, dated the 24th June, and 11th October, 1946, respectively).

**53. L. Satya Pal Prize :**

A sum of Rs.150/- was donated for this prize.

**54. L. Bishan Das Lamba Prize :**

A sum of Rs.100/- was donated for this prize.

**55. Krishan Chand Mehra Memorial Scholarship Fund:**

The total income from this endowment may be given annually in lumpsum to one or two needy brilliant students on rolls of a University Teaching Department by the Standing Scholarship Committee. The Assistant Treasurer shall annually invite applications for the purpose at the beginning of the academic session.

**56. Sheikh Mubarik Ali Endowment Fund Account:**

Sheikh Mubarik Ali donated a sum of Rs.5,000/- for award of three Gold Medals from the interest accrued on this account,namely:

**KHAN BAHADUR CHAUDHRI MUHAMMAD HUSSAIN MUBARIK ALI GOLD MEDAL** to be awarded annually to the successful woman candidate standing first in Arabic among the women candidates of the B.A.Examination.

The right to change the condition for the award of these medals is reserved with Sheikh Mubarik Ali.

**57. Mrs.Woolner Fund :**

Mrs.M.E.Woolner donated a sum of Rs. 25,200/- by her will to the University of the Punjab for the award of Alfred Woolner Scholarship. The conditions for the award of the scholarship are:-

- (i) The scholarship shall be named "the Woolner Memorial Sanskrit Scholarship".
- (ii) It will be awarded to a Graduate of the Punjab University who has distinguished himself in Sanskrit and Sanskrit Studies. Provided that if no student offers Sanskrit the scholarship may be awarded to a Graduate of the Punjab University who has distinguished himself in Arabic and Arabic Studies.
- (iii) It will be tenable for Post-graduate Research at the Oriental College, Lahore, only.
- (iv) The value of the Scholarship shall be Rs.100/- per mensum tenable for two years in the first instance. It could, however, be awarded for another year on the recommendation of the Chairman of the Sanskrit or Arabic Department of the Oriental College.
- (v) The endowment provides an income which will require the keeping in abeyance of this scholarship for a year at two or three years intervals.
- (vi) The award of the scholarship will be determined by a committee composed of the Vice-Chancellor of the Punjab University, and the Chairman of the Sanskrit or Arabic Department, Punjab University, in accordance with the requirements of the Will. The Chairman of the

Sanskrit or Arabic Department, as the case may be, will act as a member of the Committee.

- (vii) The progress of Research under this scholarship will be subject to quarterly report by the Chairman of the Sanskrit or Arabic Department of the University.
- (viii) The Committee provided under rule(vi) above, will also be competent to terminate the scholarship in the event of unsatisfactory work (vide para 6, Syndicate Proceedings, dated the 19th March, 1946).

**58. Dr.Sahib Ditta Mohan Lall Memorial Scholarship :**

This scholarship is awarded for doing research in Cancer. Late Dr.Mohan Lall bequeathed 100 Tata Iron and Steel Company, Ltd.(India),Second Preference Shares to the Punjab University for this purpose.

**59. Sheikh Muhammad Ismail Trust Fund:**

The following scholarships are awarded out of the income of the Trust:-

1. A scholarship of Rs. 25/- per mensum to the student who stands first in the B.Com. Part I Examination, irrespective of his financial position.
2. A scholarship of Rs.25/- per mensum to the poorest among the first five students passing B.Com. Part II Examination, conducted by the Punjab University.

Sheikh Naseer Ahmad purchased Government security of the face value of Rs.25,000/- in favour of the Principal,Hailey College of Commerce,Lahore, for creating a Trust fund called "Sheikh Muhammad Ismail Trust Fund" for this purpose.

**60. Dr.Kazi Said-ud-Din Ahmad Silver Medal :**

This medal is awarded annually to the student who stands first in Geography in the Bachelor of Arts Examination.

A sum of Rs. 1000/- was donated by an anonymous person for the award of a Silver Medal called "Dr.Kazi Said-ud-Din Ahmad Silver Medal".

**61. Mian Muhammad Pir Bakhsh (Bar -at-Law, Simla) Memorial Fund Gold Medal:**

This medal is awarded annually to the student who stands first among the girls students in the Final M.B.,B.S. Examination.

A sum of Rs. 2,400/- was donated by Lt. Col. Dr. F.M.Khan to commemorate the memory of his father Mian Muhammad Pir Bakhsh, Bar-at-Law, Simla.

**62. Begum Afzal Husain Gold Medal:**

This medal is awarded annually to the woman student who stands first in M.A. Examination in Islamic Studies.

A sum of Rs.3,000/- was donated by Dr. Mian M.Afzal Husain for awarding this medal in the name of his wife.

**63. Dr. Riaz Ali Shah Gold Medal:**

This medal is awarded annually to the student who stands first in the final B.D.S. Examination.

A sum of Rs. 3,000/- was donated by Dr. Riaz Ali Shah for this purpose.

**64. Safia Riaz Gold Medal:**

[This medal is awarded to a student who passed the M.D./M.S. Examination with distinction. There shall be no distinction between the First and Second Annual Examination.]<sup>1</sup>

A sum of Rs. 3,000/- was donated by Dr. Riaz Ali Shah to award Gold Medal in the name of his wife, Safia Riaz.

**65. Bata Gold Medal for Fine Arts:**

This medal is awarded annually to the student who stands first in M.A. Examination in Fine Arts.
