Publication Ethics and Malpractice statement

Our editorial team works hard to ensure the content we publish is ethically sound. To help us achieve that goal, we closely follow the advice laid out in the guidelines and flowcharts on the [COPE \(Committee on Publication Ethics\) website](#). Some of the key points to be taken into consideration by the authors are:

- A manuscript submitted to the journal should be original, which means that it should not have been published before in its current, or similar form. If any substantial element of your paper has been previously published, this will need to be declared to the journal editor upon submission. please note all submissions will be subjected to a similarity check to confirm the originality of submissions received.
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The Editorial Team of the journal intends to provide you with a professional and courteous experience at each stage of review and the publication process. However, there are some responsibilities that sit with you as an author(s). Our expectation is that you will:

- Promptly respond to all queries/emails during the publication process
- Be accountable for all aspects of the manuscript/research work submitted. This will include investigating and resolving any questions about accuracy or research integrity. The author(s) must submit original, non-plagiarised content to the journal.
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- Author(s) are also obliged to provide raw data used in estimation on the request of editors/referees.

- It is the author's responsibility to ensure that the work has not been submitted elsewhere and should not be under consideration by any other publication.
