Unity must for economic stability: Dr. Shahid Munir


Dr. Qayyum said that steps are needed to promote entrepreneurship in educational institutions. He said that investment in education, research and skilled professionals are necessary for the country's development.

Dr. Javed Akram, in his address, said that CEMB stands forefront of other life sciences departments in Molecular Biology research and researchers at CEMB are working for the welfare of common man. He applauded the efforts of scientists and staff of CEMB for working hard and developing innovative biotech products. He appreciated the productive idea of Dr. Kausar Malik to provide a platform for scientists to present their research.

Dr. Shahid Munir applauded the progress made by CEMB researchers in the field of stem cells'therapeutics and genetic diseases especially vision impairment, deafness, and intellectual disability disorders.

Dr. Kausar Malik said that CEMB has always created opportunities for our researchers to collaborate with foreign scientists and CEMB

researchers are contributing for mankind by developing products like the stem cells-based treatments for numerous pathological conditions such as wound healing including burns and diabetic wounds; ocular defects, cartilage defects such as osteoarthritis, spine injuries, liver fibrosis and diabetes.

She said that CEMB has developed methods for production of various recombinant therapeutic proteins and biosimilars such as Filgrastim, Oprelvekin, and Insulin. She said CEMB has also developed methods for indigenous production of high quality Taq Polymerase. She stressed upon the need of developing commercialized Health biotech products via cost effective innovative methods to strengthen the economy of our country.

Dr. Shahid Baig, in the concluding ceremony,

applauded the progress made by CEMB in Health Sciences and said that CEMB has always been at forefront in field of Molecular Biology.

BS - MPhil showed their keen interest in learning new insights along with Chairman Dr. Hameed and his faculty and staff members. The foreign trainers were well acquainted with their knowledge as research associates and developed the field survey framework.

The session constituted an overall view of the history of exploration and approaches used in South Asia from Colonial times till post-partition. Detailed presentation slides were made by the trainers to develop the level of understanding before proceeding to its practicality in the true field.

Different sampling methodologies and systematic survey conduction, use of transects, and preparation and adoption of a certain strategy with regard to recent technological advancements in the survey were discussed. A hand on pretraining was held on the premises of the university in which digital recording and documentation in the newly proposed application by Cambridge (ODK) were made to learn.

The informal collaboration enabled the trainers to interact and use their intuition in suggesting new ideas for the betterment of digital archaeology which they empirically witnessed in the field.

Noteworthy was the proceeding threats overlooked in the site assessment and how many of them are now encroached that once were present in the historic maps.

In addition, a formal meeting of the core team with Dean Faculty of Arts and Humanities Prof. Dr. Amra Raza who welcomed the delegates and appreciated the joint efforts by awarding them certificates.
