Joint efforts a must to combat coronavirus, natural calamities

Development and Special Initiatives
Asad Umar has stressed the need for
making joint efforts to cope with the
challenges of pandemics like COVID-19 and
natural calamities. He was addressing the
inaugural session of a two-day national
conference on 'Challenges of Governance in
Pakistan Amid Covid-19 Pandemic' organised
by Punjab University's Department of Political
Science.

In his video link address, Asad Umar said that during COVID-19, the government also faced multiple challenges of saving the economy

along with the health of people, due to which, the National Coordinating Committee (NCC) and National Command and Operations Centre (NCOC) were set up to deal with the challenges and portray a true picture of the situation to people.

He said the government and the military leadership together in the NCOC made best decisions in the national interest. He


said the NCOC decided to enforce lockdown, hotspot lockdown and smart lockdown based on daily data so that people's health and economic condition could not be affected. The Minister added that he made all the decisions keeping in view the situation of his country after learning from other countries. He said the process of vaccination had started and a uniform policy was applied to the rich and the poor and even the President and the Prime Minister had received their vaccines by their turn.

Asad Umar said use of technology through various applications had made it easier to calculate number of patients in hospitals to

ensure timely availability of oxygen and other equipment, besides assessment of the condition of beds for critical cases. He said that through artificial intelligence, the government was formulating a comprehensive plan for future so that an effective and integrated strategy could be formulated to tackle challenges like corona.

PU RANKING IMPROVES BY 16% IN 3 YEARS

QS WORLD UNIVERSITY RANKINGS

HE QS World University Rankings, which is officially recognized by the Government of the Punjab and Punjab Higher Education Commission, has ranked Punjab University among top 62 percent universities of the world placing PU among top 801-1000 universities in its fresh ranking for 2022.

PU Vice Chancellor Prof Niaz Ahmed said that QS has ranked Punjab University among the best 78.5 percent universities of the world in 2018. He further said that in just three years, PU's international ranking had improved by 16 percent and for the year 2022, it has been counted among top 61.6 percent universities of the world, which was a landmark achievement because it was very difficult to improve university ranking at international level because of tough competition among the varsities throughout the world.

"PU's Asia ranking had improved 54 times in just two years and The Nature Publishing Group has ranked Punjab University No 1 in terms of research publications in the field of natural sciences amongst all Pakistani universities" Prof. Dr. Niaz Ahmed

Prof Niaz Ahmed said that in 2018, PU's five subjects were ranked international for the first time and PU was improving its subject-wise ranking manifold every year. He said that PU has also improved its Asian ranking and it stands on 178th position, making a considerable jump of 54 points in just two years. He said that PU was ranked 232nd in 2018's ranking of Asian universities and it has improved its ranking manifold in a period of just two years. He said that the initiatives the administration had taken for improvement in international ranking had started bringing fruit.

He said that due to promotion of research culture, the



research publications of the university had increased and the university for the first time in PU's history allocated a hefty amount of Rs380 million for research last year as it was top priority of the administration. He said that teacher-student ratio had been maintained, appointments of PhD degree holders as faculty members had been made and collaboration with international organizations had been enhanced, which had mainly contributed to university's rapid improvement in QS ranking.

He said that the university was making rapid progress in all the disciplines. He said that PU was full of potential and its ranking would be improved further in the upcoming world rankings. He said that the university administration has focused on good governance, restoration of PU's academic excellence and research with socio-economic impact.

He said that the university had regulated all statutory bodies of the university and all its organs were fully functional. He said that streamlining the university's system would help improve international ranking of the university. He appreciated Chairman Ranking Committee Prof Dr Khalid Mahmood for making efforts to improve the university's ranking and congratulated PU faculty members, employees and students on this achievement.

PU researchers invent novel method to

convert agri-waste into edible sugar

research team under the aegis of Punjab University Centre for Research in Ionic Liquids (CRIL) Director Dr Maliha Uroos developed a protocol to convert agricultural waste into food. The food grade glucose produced can be used for human consumption; in pharmaceuticals, general food industry and also for the production of artificial proteins.

The CRIL had been recently established by PU Vice Chancellor Prof Dr Niaz Ahmed Akhtar during restructuring of the university with an aim to resolve socio-economic problems of Pakistan and this research was the first landmark step to achieve the goals of its establishment. The work was published in a highly reputed international journal of American Chemical Society named "ACS Sustainable Chemistry & Engineering" with an impact factor of 7.63.

This research contribution was made possible by her PhD student Azmat Mehmood Asim, in collaboration with Prof. Jason Hallett, Imperial College London and Dr. Nawshad Muhammad, Khyber Medical University. The method used the highly desirable and environment friendly solvents; the biocompatible lonic Liquids. Pakistan as an agricultural country is highly rich in agricultural waste. PU researchers successfully produced food grade sugars from the waste of wheat and rice straw that had no

significant use except burning at the end, causing smog and increase in pollution.

This was the first time that these materials had been considered for human food. In view of the reports from world-wide organizations such as the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), food sources were

becoming insufficient with every passing day.

According to these intimations, carbohydrates and proteins, the primary human food nutrients, will become less available for a huge population in the future. Alternate technologies, thus, should be developed to combat these imminent

ABSTRACT: The anticipated high future demand for food proteins has led to the advent of mycoprotein, which involves carbohydrate sugars as the primary carbon source. In this work, nonfood rice and wheat residues have been utilized to produce food-grade glucose using an ionic liquid. A biocompatible ionic liquid (IL) based on food-grade cholinium hydroxide and lysine has been evaluated for its potential to remove undesirable components such as, lignin and hemicellulose from rice and wheat straws. The cellulose pulp, thus obtained, was subsequently hydrolyzed into glucose by using food-grade enzymes. The optimum delignification efficiency of the IL is 87% at 120 °C after 8 h pretreatment. The optimum yield of food-grade sugar was 77% from cellulose pulp after processing at 100 °C for 8 h. The analysis of the pulp and lignin was made using compositional analysis, FT-IR, TGA, and SEM techniques, whereas glucose was quantified using HPLC. The food-grade glucose



may be used in the food industry or pharmaceuticals, but this study aims at synthesizing mycoprotein in the future.



Senior journalist Salman Ghani said that Dr. Mughees not only equipped us with technical skills but also, he trained us ideologically.



He said that colonialism had badly abused human beings and common people had suffered a lot. He said that the Palestine issue must be resolved peacefully and human rights must be ensured at all cost. He also criticized the ban on press freedom.

Leen Saleh said that innocent Palestinians has been forced to leave their places and they were living a life of migrant in nearby areas. She said that Palestinian migrants has their lands but they don't have their home there.

Dr Sima Samar saluted the struggle of Palestinians and said that they were paying a very heavy price for their rights. She said that all the religions condemn terrorism and therefore Palestine issue must be resolved peacefully.

Prof Dr Abida Ashraf said that a ceasefire would not bring change in Palestine. She said that along with innocent civilians, journalists and human rights activists had also been
