

Addressing the meeting, Muhammad Balighur Rehman said that there is a need to focus on character building and training of students along with imparting quality education. He said that the youth has to be advised that they have to adopt honesty, ethics and truth in every field of life. He expressed that we should highlight good things of each other instead of pointing out bad things.

He added that hate speech is not allowed anywhere in the world, but our young generation has been given the wrong impression in some aspects of life that they are right and all others are wrong. He stressed that the culture of tolerance should be promoted among the youth and they should be taught to

respect difference of opinion.

He vowed that due to the promotion of hate politics, the children went so far that they desecrated the memorials of martyrs who got Nishan Haider, sacrificed their lives for our beloved homeland and shouted hateful slogans against the opponents even in a holy city like Madina. He said that this is a tool of the enemies of the country to spread disappointment among in the next generation.

He advised that social media must be used with immense care and one should verify facts before forwarding any post. He said that Punjab University was the biggest and oldest university in the region where more steps should be taken to promote quality education. He highlighted that for the development of any institution, its merits and demerits should be known so that matters can be improved.

He said that universities have to adopt various measures to deal with their financial problems. He also instructed the Punjab



University administration to prepare a master plan. He said that the aim of the universities is to promote the creation of new knowledge and research for which faculty development program should be improved further.

He said that universities should establish Zakat fund for needy students. He shed light that the institutions should keep close contact with their alumni and their achievements should be celebrated at the official level. He said that alumni endowment fund should be established to provide scholarships to poor students.

Vice Chancellor Professor Dr. Khalid Mehmood highlighted the ongoing educational, constructive and research activities in Punjab University. He said that

Punjab University gets 73% of its budget from its own resources and only 27% comes from the government. He said that Punjab University is currently facing financial problems for which funding is required from central and provincial governments. He said that despite such limited resources, Punjab University is providing quality education to its on-campus 52,000 students with excellent transport, internet and providing residential facilities to 8,500 students. He said that there are more than eleven hundred teachers at Punjab University and most of them have earned their PhDs from top universities. He said that Punjab University has moved from 232nd position to 140th position in QS Asia ranking in five years despite such limited

resources. He said that earlier three of our subjects were included in the global ranking initially but now their number has increased to 14 with the efforts of the administration and faculty members. He said that the role of Punjab University in the promotion of knowledge and literature is commendable and PU students have also been a part of Pakistan Movement under the leadership of Quaid-i-Azam. After discussion on various agenda items based οn recommendations of the Syndicate, the agenda items were approved with minor improvements. In the meeting, 15% special allowance was also approved for employees and teachers of Punjab University from grade 1 to grade 19.

In his address, Prof Ahsan Iqbal said that universities are centers of research and innovation that find solutions to problems. He said that due to the policies of the previous government, Pakistan has suffered an economic heart attack and if the situation is not changed in the future, the situation may become more dangerous.

He expressed that hate was spread through social media to divide the nation and the use of such language became common that even PhD scholars could not avoid it. "The bullet in my body is a reminder of the hatred and extremism that a party has spread," he said.

Ahsan Iqbal said that like a computer, the virus

of hatred also goes into the brain and becomes a pest for the society. He vowed that in the last few years, every section, including the youth, was incited for the politics of hatred.

He said that Pakistan needs development projects which were reduced a lot in the previous government and the current government is starting development projects again for the development of Pakistan. He said that he went to Pasheen, Pasni and other such areas to inaugurate university campuses and development projects.

He expressed that in the previous regime, we had included energy, elimination of terrorism and economic reforms in our top priorities, this time five E's i.e. exports, E-Pakistan, equity, environmental and food security and energy will be our priority.

He further said that the digital revolution had come in the world, in the next ten years, many jobs will not be needed and they will be replaced by artificial intelligence and new opportunities. He expressed that educational institutions should play their dynamic role in the creation of new knowledge and promote research according to the needs of the industry. He said that teachers should update themselves and teach modern knowledge to the youth through faculty development program. He said that when the government came to power in 2013, there was an energy crisis in the country, there was terrorism and the economic situation was also worse than ever.

He explained that our government not only eradicated terrorism from the country, but

added 11,000 megawatts to the power system to overcome the energy crisis and reduced load shedding to zero along with eliminating terrorism and especially, the life of Karachi, the city of lights, was restored. He said that our government introduced such an economic policy after which the world declared it a safe country for investment and the ambassadors of developed countries used to ask me for the investment of the companies of their countries.

He advised the youth not to let the shadow of prejudice fall on the mind which kills creativity. He said that he feels proud for Punjab University for the completion of the project approved by his previous government. He said that at present the country is standing at a crossroads and facing many challenges for which the nation needs seriousness so that together we can take the country forward.

Dr Shahid Munir said that seventeen billion dollars are being spent on importing diesel, furnace oil, LNG and RLNG, if the same money is spent on Pakistani energy projects, then there will be a good result for the economy. He said that the Institute of Energy and Environmental Engineering has the world's best laboratories for higher education and research. He said that two mega projects were completed in PU in the last 14 years and both of them have been completed due to the special efforts of Prof Ahsan lqbal. He said that Pakistan is facing problems like climate change, for which the institute will provide support.

Dr Khalid Mahmood said that PU was

supported by the federal government in several projects. He said that with the support of the government, they are trying to give very affordable education to the poor students. He expressed that increasing the development funds of Higher Education Commission in the budget is a good initiative, but due to the increase in salaries by the federal government, the recurring budget of the HEC is not sufficient to bear the impact. Therefore, he added, the government must increase the recurring budget of HEC to bear the impact of increase in salaries. 'Most of our funding goes to salaries, pensions and research', he said.

He thanked Ahsan Iqbal for his full cooperation in the completion of the project.

PUCRIL wins Prime Minister's National Innovation Award




UNJAB University School of Chemistry's Centre for Research in Ionic Liquids (CRIL) has achieved a matter of immense pride.



EXPERTS MEET FOR QUALITY SEEDS OF RICE, WHEAT, COTTON

Meeting of the committee to carry out the latest Research for Development of Quality Seeds of Rice, Wheat and Cotton was held at committee room of PU Vice Chancellor's office. Chairman, Rice Research & Development Board Punjab Shahzad Ali Malik, Office of Research, Innovation and Commercialization Director Prof Dr Shakeel Ahmad and other officials participated in the meeting.

Addressing the meeting, Mr Malik stressed the need for immediate steps to increase per acre yield of field crops through higher yielding varieties which is possible by rewarding breeders through a lucrative incentive package/scheme. He highlighted that out of five major field crops Rice, Maize, Cotton, Wheat and Sugar Cane, only two crops, Rice and Maize performed well due to high yield varieties with the main contribution of private sector. He said rice and maize helped Pakistan achieve local demand, export earnings and import substitution.

Mr Malik reiterated that solution of the current situation lies in the agro based economy and we need to focus seriously.
