CPEC comprises multidimensional projects with its road links linking all the provinces and territories into a close-knit economic unit. In 2004, the government conducted a study which suggested that the money collected through toll from the route only would be equivalent to the total budget of Pakistan at that time. Another finding of the study was Pakistan would witness rapid economic growth

and Pakistan's 1.5 to two rupees would be equivalent to one dollar. CPEC would really be a game changer for Pakistan. There are only 67 berths in UAE port while Gawadar would have 120 berths thus one can imagine the volume of economic activities and development in Pakistan.

PU scientists including Dr. Tayyab Husnain, Dr. Idrees Nasir, Dr. Ahmed Ali Shahid, Dr. Kausar Malik, Dr. Bushra Rashid and Dr. Abdul Qayyum have invented three new high yielding BT cotton seed varieties named as CEMB-33, CEMB-Klean Cotton and CA-12. These varieties are disease and insect resistant, and drought tolerant.

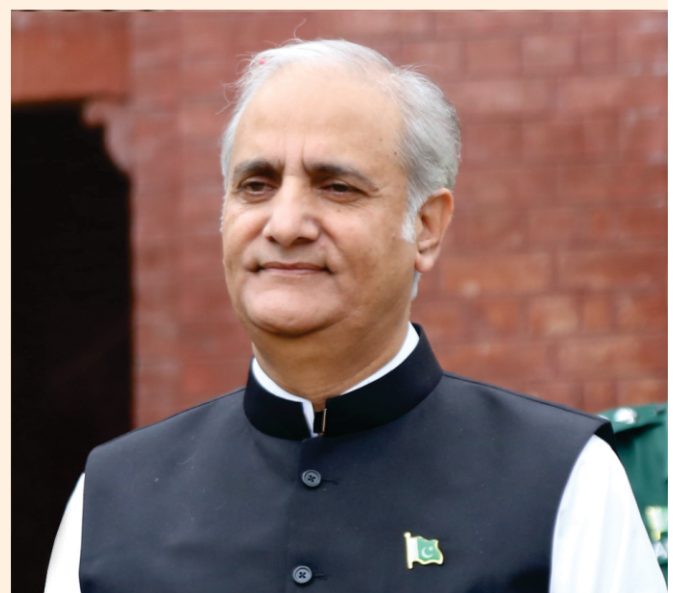
The genetically modified BT cotton seed varieties would be commercialized through seed marketing companies for use in Pakistani agriculture sector to generate additional revenue for university. Eight international companies have shown their interest to purchase these seeds. The invention of weedicide, insect resistant BT cotton seed varieties would contribute Rs 144b to Pakistan's economy. Our nation pays taxes on everything, we want to give them something in return. This contribution will surely play a great role in socio-economic development of the country.

I want other departments and research centres of Punjab University to come up with new inventions and innovations giving practical

solutions to everyday life problems. The social sciences researchers must also focus on social problems including element of extremism and terrorism to help promote peace in Pakistan."

CPEC: Political, Economic & Social Perspectives



CPEC Integrated Study Centre established at PU

An international conference on “China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC): political, economic and social perspectives” was organized by Punjab University Department of History & Pakistan Studies at Al Raazi Hall here on Sept 11-12, 2017.

Punjab Minister for Higher Education Syed Raza Ali Gilani, Vice chancellor Dr Zafar Mueen Nasir, Dr. Taqi Zahid Butt, DG Punjab Higher Education Commission Dr. Shahid Soroya, conference chief organizer and Dean Faculty of Arts and Humanities Prof Dr Iqbal Chawla, Vice Chancellor Shaheed Benazir Bhutto Women University Peshawar Prof Dr Razia Sultana, Director History Department Nanjing University China Prof Dr Yu Wenjie, Vice President Nanjing University, Xianlin Campus Dr Zhu Qinbao, Dr. Mahboob Hussain, researchers from abroad and various parts of country, faculty members and a large number of students were present on the occasion.

On the occasion Punjab University announced the establishment of CPEC Integrated Centre at PU Quaid-i-Azam campus for providing the country a platform for research on CPEC and its various dimensions.

Punjab Minister for Higher Education Syed Raza Ali Gilani said that China Pakistan Economic Corridor would guarantee socio-economic development of Pakistan and time would come when 1 dollar would be equivalent to 2 Pakistani rupees. He said that CPEC included multidimensional projects with its road links linking all the provinces and territories into a close-knit economic unit. He said that in 2004, the government had conducted a study which suggested that the money collected through toll from the CPEC route only would be equivalent to the total budget of Pakistan at that time. He said that another finding of the study was Pakistan would witness rapid economic growth and Pakistan's 1.5 to 2 rupees would be equivalent to 1 dollar.

VC Dr. Zafar Moeen Nasir said that no country was willing to invest in Pakistan when China invested 46 billion dollars for the country's development in major sectors. He said that China would get shortest trade route to export its goods while Pakistan would also take maximum benefits from the opportunity. He said that Pakistani people were facing poverty and CPEC would bring prosperity to the households. He said that through CPEC Integrated Study Centre at



PU, we would portray the right image of CPEC before the international community because some negative lobbies were propagating against the CPEC.

Prof Dr Taqi Zahid Butt said the centre would serve as a platform for gathering and dissemination of important evolving and latest information about the development relating to the CPEC. He said that it would also serve as a catalyst for developing ever-closer ties between Pakistan and China through frequent exchange of scholars, researchers, academicians and specialists in related areas.

PHEC DG Dr. Shahid Soroya said that CPEC was an opportunity as well as a challenge. He said that there were two important challenges in CPEC project i.e. provision of skilled force and development of human resource. He said that PHEC had taken up these issues seriously and we would set up technology universities and PHEC was signing MoUs with Chinese universities for exchange programs.

Nanjing University Vice President Prof Dr Zhu Qingbao said, "efforts were being made to enhance cooperation between the great neighbours. We need to advance practically and work collectively in the fields of archeology, culture, history etc.

VC SBBWU Dr. Razia Sultana said that Pakistan and China enjoyed 70 years long friendship. She said that CPEC would not prove East India Company rather it must be understood as game-changer for Pakistan. She said that CPEC project would boost four major sectors in Pakistan, i.e. transport infrastructure, energy sector, industrial development and Gawader port. She said that the country would also earn huge revenue through tourism.

Conference chief organizer Prof Dr Iqbal Chawla said that the two-day international conference provided an important platform for renowned historians, economists and social scientists from China, England, Poland, Australia and Pakistan to deliberate, discuss and analyze important aspects of CPEC.

229,401 candidates appeared in Exam 2017

The total candidates appeared in BA/BSc Annual Examination 2017 are 229,401 out of which 87,926 candidates passed the exams while the overall pass percentage is 38.32. The total candidates appeared in BA/BSc Annual Examination Part-I 2017 are 133,892 out of which 48,633 candidates passed the exams while the pass percentage is 36.32. The total candidates

appeared in BA/BSc Annual Examination Part-II 2017 are 75,376 out of which 33,154 candidates passed the exams while the pass percentage is 43.98. Total candidate appeared in BA/BSc Annual Examination 2017 (Composite) are 20,133 out of which 6,139 candidates passed the exams while the pass percentage is 30.49.

Prof. Dr. Agnieszka Kuszewska from Institute of Social Sciences, University of Social Sciences & Humanities, Warsaw, Poland said that teaching was a difficult job and we needed to learn from students as well. She said that we ought to keep our minds open to entertain new ideas.



Pakistan-Russia and Sino-Pak ties prompted Trump's statement!

Punjab University Pakistan Study Centre organized a seminar on "President Trump's Policy in South Asia: The impact on Pakistan" on September 12, 2017.

Prof. Dr. Agnieszka Kuszewska and Dr. Agnieszka Nitza-Makowska from Institute of Social Sciences, University of Social Sciences & Humanities, Warsaw, Poland were guest speakers on the occasion. Pakistan Study Centre Acting Director Dr. Amjad Abbas Magsi, Prof Dr Aqdas Ali Kazmi, Dr Ahmed Ejaz, faculty members and a large number of students were present on the occasion.

The keynote speaker, Prof. Dr. Agnieszka Kuszewska, an expert on South Asia especially India and Pakistan, said that one of the reasons behind Trump's statement was to counter Pakistan-Russia growing relations and Russia's influence in the region. She said this was not the first time that eyebrows were raised due to the statements from the USA and current American president. She said Trump's policy was a hard power policy based on realism to strengthen its strategic presence in the region.

However, she observed that Pakistan would remain a significant ally of the USA despite of the statements given by American leaders. Pakistan-USA relations deteriorated since 2011 after Usama Bin Laden incident. She concluded by saying that Pakistan should adopt its policy in accordance with contemporary geopolitical dynamics. One should not rely on only one ally in international polity.

Dr. Agnieszka Nitza- Makowska, in her address focused on "The Dynamics of Contemporary International-Relations: The CPEC and Brexit". The CPEC in the long run will influence Pakistan-EU bilateral cooperation. Their relations are economic oriented rather than strategic one. The GSP plus gives Pakistan almost duty-free access to EU market. From Pakistan's perspective economy and cooperation with the EU would be the most productive in infrastructure, energy production and in the sectors



of communication, metallurgy and irrigation etc. However, the EU may miss the opportunities provided by the CPEC as it remains challenged by Brexit. London, due to its ties with Islamabad, may appear more attractive partner to Pakistan than the EU.

In his opening remarks, Dr. Magsi said that President Trump's comment had raised a lot of concerns in the minds of all walks of life in Pakistan. He said that it was a shared viewpoint in Pakistan that US had not fully judged the position of Pakistan in its struggle in war on terrorism.





PU, Nanjing University to collaborate on research

Punjab University and China's Nanjing University have signed a memorandum of understanding for initiating joint scientific research projects on China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

The MoU signing ceremony was held at the committee room of Vice Chancellor's office. PU VC Dr Zafar Mueen Nasir, Dean Faculty of Arts and Humanities Prof. Dr Iqbal Chawla, Registrar Dr Muhammad Khalid Khan, Nanjing University's Vice President Prof. Dr Zhu Qingbao, Director History Department Prof. Dr Yu Wenjie, Director External Linkages Dr Fauzia Hadi Ali, deans of various faculties and faculty members were present on the occasion.

Addressing the ceremony, Dr Zafar Mueen Nasir said

that cooperation amongst Pakistani and Chinese universities in various areas of mutual interest was a need of the hour to strengthen Pak-China relations further. He said that PU and Nanjing University would launch joint research projects on various aspects of CPEC and there would be exchange of delegations between the two universities. Dr Zhu Qingbao stressed the need to enhance cooperation in various academic fields between the two universities and invited PU delegation to visit Nanjing University.

Bhutto Medical University

Punjab University (PU) and Shaheed Zulfiqar Ali Bhutto Medical University (SZABMU) have signed a memorandum of understanding to share human and technical resources in research and development. In this regard, an MoU signing ceremony was held at committee room of Vice Chancellor's office in which PU Vice Chancellor Dr Zafar Mueen Nasir, SZABMU Vice Chancellor Prof Dr Javed Akram, PU Centre of Excellence for Molecular Biology (CEMB) Director Prof Dr Tayyeb Husnain, PU Registrar Dr Muhammad Khalid Khan, PU Dean Faculty of Health Sciences and renowned orthopedic surgeon Prof Dr Syed Muhammad Awais, Director External Linkages Dr Fauzia Hadi Ali, SZABMU Registrar Dr Ayesha and others were present on the occasion.





According to MoU, CEMB and SZABMU would exchange and disseminate scientific data, skills and techniques and would utilize advanced research facilities and clinical materials in their respective laboratories in cooperative projects of research. Both the universities would jointly undertake training programs to generate cadre of specifically trained manpower through training courses, symposia and seminars. According to MoU, subject to personnel and budgetary limitations, CEMB undertakes to help SZABMU for establishing recombinant DNA, regenerative medicine and neonatal screening, laboratory and protein purification infrastructure for the applications of stem cell therapy and production of pharmaceutical proteins while SZABMU would provide laboratory space on one of its campuses. Both the universities also agreed to extend cooperation in various other areas of mutual interest. Dr Zaffar Mueen Nasir and Dr Javed Akram agreed

that the MoU was a good initiative to move forward in research and development in the relevant scientific fields. They said that this scientific and technical cooperation would advance the existing practices in clinical and medical molecular biology and strengthen the ongoing R&D activities in health and medicine.

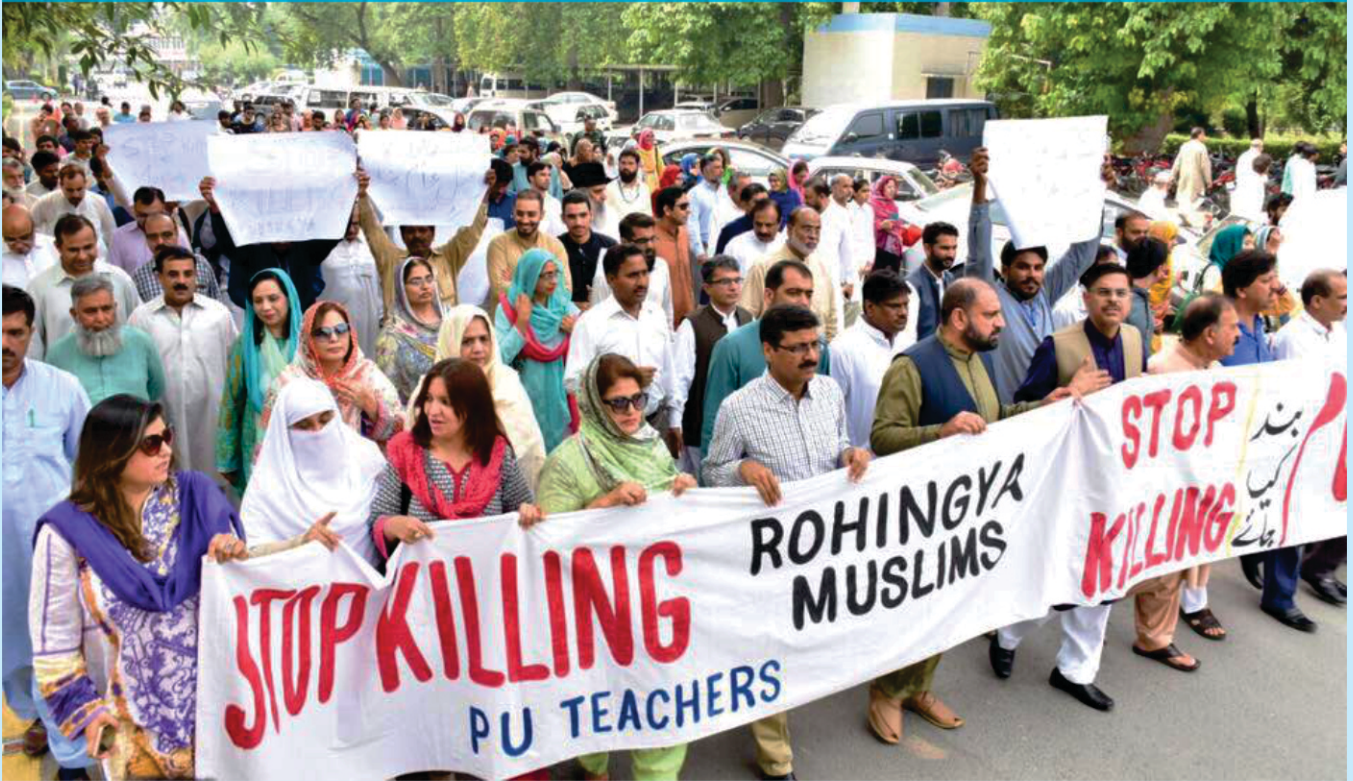

Eligibility for BS or Equivalent:

- The candidates holding F.A./F.Sc or equivalent qualification with at least 2nd division and age not more than 24 years are eligible for admission in relevant programs. 3rd division holder candidate is not eligible for admission.
- 2 marks will be deducted from percent academic marks for each late session to a maximum of previous 5 sessions/years for male and female students.
- Clearance of Pre-Admission Entry Test is mandatory for the admission against merit as well as reserved seats only in the Departments/Institutes/Centres/Colleges who have opted for the Entry Test.

Eligibility for MA/M.Sc or Equivalent:

- The candidates holding B.A./B.Sc (14-Years of Education) or equivalent qualification with at least 2nd Division and age not more than 26 years are eligible for admission. The age limit of candidates applying for Masters Program in College of Art & Design should not be more than 28 years. 3rd division holder candidate is not eligible for admission. No student shall be admitted to a second or subsequent Master's degree or Law Courses (Regular and Self-supporting Program) in the University Departments.
- 2 marks will be deducted from percent academic marks for each late session to a maximum of previous 5 sessions/years for male and female students.
- 50% seats are reserved for graduates from Punjab University and rest 50% shall be filled on open merit basis. Clearance of Pre-Admission Entry Test is mandatory for the admission against merit as well as reserved seats only in the Departments/Institutes/Centres/Colleges who have opted for the Entry Test.

Those departments who have opted the Entry Test for BS/MA/M.Sc or equivalent (admissions) shall be made on the basis of 70% academics and 30% Entry Test performance while rest of departments shall be made (admissions) on open merit basis. For College of Art & Design, the merit shall be made on the basis of 50% Academic & 50% Entry Test performance and interview. Testimonials (not necessarily attested) should be attached with the Application Form. Incomplete forms shall not be entertained.

The above mentioned rules related to age shall not apply to the candidates seeking admission in Self Supporting (Evening) programs.

Note: Punjab Educational Endowment Fund (PEEF) is providing scholarship to deserving and meritorious students who get them enrolled in the University of the Punjab.

Admissions on Sports Seat:

- 2% seats have been reserved for admission on Sports basis. Only those students/candidates are eligible to apply for admission on sports basis who have participated in Sports Trials and their names have been recommended by Sports Based Admission Committee, headed by Director Sports. No other candidates will be considered for admission on sports basis.

Admission on Reserved Seats other than Sports Seats:
