#### **Course Introduction**

This course is designed to provide students with opportunities to learn the basic elements of sociology as an analytical social science. It explores the relationship between individual experiences and broader social forces, examining how various social institutions, processes and structures shape human behavior and societal outcomes. Through this course, students will develop a sociological perspective, enabling them to analyze and understand the complexities of social life.
