Course Introduction

This course is for beginners, people with very little or no previous experience with Spanish. Please see me if you have taken previous Spanish courses or if you have had other substantive contact with the Spanish language. This semester will provide you with a basic knowledge of Spanish through the practice of speaking, listening, reading and writing, as well as work with cultural materials. Classes will be conducted in Spanish as much as possible and emphasis will be placed on correct pronunciation.

This is a rigorous program of study, which requires the completion of daily written homework assignments and preparation for communicative activities in class. The primary objective of this course is to develop the skills of communication: speaking, listening, reading and writing; and transcultural and technological skills necessary for students to achieve communicative competence, the ability to successfully negotiate meaning in the Spanish language in an increasingly multi-lingual and multi-cultural global community. Classroom policy is based on recent second-language acquisition research, which indicates that the development of communicative competence in the target language requires a maximum of comprehensive input and practice opportunity in the classroom. In accordance with this research, Spanish will be the primary language of instruction and communication in the classroom. Only in necessary cases English will be used. The secondary objective is to integrate multimedia and hypermedia language learning resources, which are destined to enrich and enhance the learning environment outside of the classroom and to provide time for communicative interaction with the instructor and peers in the classroom.

Course pacing: Learners work at different speeds. By reviewing student course evaluations over the years, I feel that I have set the pace that will be of benefit to the greatest number of learners. Nevertheless, the course will still seem too fast for some and too slow for others. If you are in either of these categories, please see your instructor outside of class for help. Spanish 1 is a three credit course. That means that we will meet for class three times a week for an hour each time usually in J5.

- 3. Be able to ask for directions
- 4. Be able to ask basic personal questions
- 5. Be able to go shopping
