#### Course Introduction

In this course of *Uloom ul Qur'an*, students will explore into advanced topics essential for understanding the nuances and intricacies of Quranic sciences. It explores the principles and methodologies behind the interpretation of the Quran, focusing on the causes of misinterpretation due to linguistic ambiguities and contextual misunderstandings, particularly stemming from the rules of Arabic syntax and semantics. Students explore into the significance of profound Quranic themes and occasions, analyzing their historical and contextual relevance. Additionally, the course covers the principles of elucidating the Quranic text through the study of its linguistic aspects and rhetorical devices, as well as the science of pauses and beginnings, highlighting their importance in understanding the Quran's message accurately. Through rigorous study and analysis, students will gain a deep understanding of the fundamental principles of Quranic sciences and develop advanced skills in interpreting and contextualizing the divine message of the Quran.

# **Learning Outcomes**

By the end of this course, students will be able:

- 1. To develop a comprehensive understanding of the principles and methodologies underlying Quranic interpretation, including the rules of Arabic syntax and semantics, linguistic analysis, and contextual interpretation, enabling them to critically engage with and analyze various interpretations of the Quran.
- 2. Through the study of causes of misinterpretation, particularly stemming from linguistic ambiguities and contextual misunderstandings, students will develop the ability to identify and critically evaluate instances of misinterpretation in Quranic exegesis, fostering a deeper appreciation of the importance of accurate interpretation in understanding the Quran's message.
- 3. Students will gain proficiency in advanced Quranic sciences such as 'Ilm al-Wujuh wal-Nazair (the science of Quranic themes and occasions) and 'Ilm al-Waqf wal-Ibtida (the science of pauses and beginnings), enabling them to analyze profound Quranic themes, occasions, and rhetorical devices, and apply them effectively in interpreting and contextualizing the Quranic text.



Students engage with a wide spectrum of texts, including academic scholarship, media representations, literary works, and political discourse, employing advanced theoretical frameworks such as postcolonial theory, critical race theory, and cultural studies to deconstruct prevailing narratives and uncover underlying power dynamics and ideological agendas. Through rigorous examination and interdisciplinary inquiry, students explore how Western constructions of Islam have evolved over time, examining themes of identity, representation, othering, and the impact of colonial legacies on contemporary perceptions. The course encourages students to contribute original research that advances understanding of the complex interplay between Western discourses and Islam, fostering critical scholarship that challenges stereotypes, fosters mutual understanding, and promotes dialogue across cultures.
