

Foreword

The brief fact book on the University of the Punjab (PU) will give the reader all basic facts and figures pertaining to PU in 2011. I would like to thank Prof. Dr. Mansoor Sarwar for his thought and effort in preparing this booklet which was conceived by the two of us together. I would also like to thank Ms. Maria Maldonado for her contribution during the initial phase of the work.

As the reader will notice, certain basic parameters, which indicate the performance of a university, have improved steadily and very significantly since January 2008 when the present administration assumed charge. The number of research publications in journals carrying an impact-factor has more than doubled from 162 in 2007 to 352 in 2010. In the first seven months of 2011 we have over 320 such publications – this number is likely to cross the 450 mark by the end of the year. Publications in HEC recognized journals are in addition to these. The number of books published by PU faculty members in the period 2008 till the writing of these lines is 215 i.e. an average of 55 per year. In 2007 this number stood at only 27.

Research funding has been increased from Rs 4 million in 2007-2008 to Rs 70 million in 2011-12. A research endowment fund of Rs 250 million exists in addition to this research funding. Funds for Faculty Development have been enhanced from Rs 45 million in 2007-2008 to 75 million in 20011-12. This is in addition to HEC funded Faculty Development program. Under the two programs over 100 faculty members have been sent abroad for PhD studies and many of them have returned in the past one or two years adding to the pool of PhDs in PU. A 20 million endowment for Employees welfare has also been created. The investment of PU has risen from 1.85 billion in June 2008 to 3.8 billion in June 2011.

For the first time in PU history, the full-time faculty strength crossed the landmark number of 1000. The PhD to non PhD teacher ratio has also increased by 10% for regular faculty members since 2008, jumping from 29% for regular faculty members at the end of 2007 to 39.5% in 2011. PhD production has suddenly risen from an average of 41 per annum during 1990-2007 to 113 per annum during the period 2008 to 30 September 2011. The national ranking of PU has also improved in 2010 by two steps, from 6th to 4th out of the 91 universities ranked by HEC.

Our students have performed extremely well in all kinds of cocurricular activities in previous years as will be seen from various tables. In 2010, more than 40% regular full-time students were given scholarships worth about Rs 100 million, mostly through PU income (Rs 71 million). The Government of the Punjab also provided scholarships worth 22.75 million approximately.

Regular convocations on a yearly basis have been restored after four decades. The institution of Professor Emeritus has been revived after a decade and a half, a revival which has been applauded by intellectual circles of the country. The academic atmosphere has been restored after decades.

At the end of the booklet we have a list of FAQ's and answers. It is hoped that this fact book, the first ever published by the University of the Punjab, will be of use to anyone seeking information about this institution that can be obtained at a glance.




