Minister of Pakistan from 2002 until his resignation in 2004. He was the first and only elected prime minister from Balochistan. He is generally remembered as an honest and good natured politician of Pakistan.

WEBINAR ON Parliamentary Elections in Kazakhstan



On 28th December, Center for Global & Strategic Studies (CGSS), Islamabad organized an Online Conference on, "Kazakhstan's Parliamentary Election 2021: A Way Forward for Further Strengthening Democracy & Political Setup".

The conference was commenced with the speech of Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Chairman, Department of History & Pakistan Studies, University of Punjab, Lahore. He discussed Kazakhstan Parliamentary Election 2021: A Giant Step Towards Liberal and Functional Democracy. He mentioned the historical and cultural importance of Central Asia dating back to ancient times. Hundreds of poets, writers, and Sufis migrated from central Asia to South Asia, thereby contributing significantly to the literature, history, science, and culture of South Asia.Dr. Mahboob highlighted that the upcoming elections on 10th January 2021 are an important step towards the political institutionalization setup in the country. Several reforms have been introduced for the upcoming elections in terms of representation and constitutional requirements. It is a very important step in terms of institution building, especially the political institutionalization building.

Mr. Ghazi Muhammad Abdullah discussed blessings of Political system in Kazakhstan. He highlighted that this topic is very important viz a viz the current political situation in Kazakhstan. It is a country that is economically, politically, historically, geographically and in the foreign policy paradigm is one of the most important countries in Central Asia. The upcoming elections will have a long-term impact on the regional politics and economies of neighboring countries and their relation with China and Russia as well.

The conference was moderated by Ms. Palwasha Nawaz, Project Executive, CGSS, and was attended by 50 participants including students and members of academia. It was also viewed by 100 people on social media networks.

LECTURE OF DILVIR SINGHPUNNU



Dr. Dalvir Singh Pannu, USA based scholar, Author of "The Sikh Heritage: Beyond Borders" visited Department of History & Pakistan Studies on 29th December and he give a talk on "Sources on Sikh History and heritage". He focused on Pakistan's cultural heritage, history of Sikh religious sites, Persian sources and other topics related to history. Prof. Syed Qamar Abbas presided over the function while it was attended by faculty and students.



PROF. DR KHURRAM QADIR SPEAKS ON "HUMAN MIND & EPISTEMOLOGICAL APPROACHES"

On 31st December, former Chairman, Department of History, Baha-ud-Din Zikriya University Multan and ex-Director, National Institute of Historical and Cultural Research Islamabad gave a talk on 'Human Mind and Epistemological Approaches'. Prof. Khurram Qadir argued that western analytical epistemological approach has largely failed to solve human problems and there is a dire need to



look for other approaches. He emphasised that holistic and organic approaches can be used for extending human knowledge. He also mentioned that current units of analysis, like ethnicity, religion, nationality etc. are insufficient to fully grasp the complexities of human history. He suggested that *shazra* and *shiraza* should be used as temporal-spatial units for historical analysis. The talk was followed by question- answer session. Prof. Syed Qamar Abbas and Prof. Mahboob Hussain spoke at the end and appreciated the new perspectives put forward by Prof. Khurram Qadir.

MEETING OF BOARD OF FACULTY OF ARTS AND Humanities



On September 1, an important meeting of the Faculty Board was held which was presided over by Prof. Dr. Amera Raza, Dean of faculty. INTRODUCTION TO THE DEPARTMENT

Department of History, University of the Punjab, is the oldest post-graduate teaching institution in Pakistan and one of the renowned centers of excellence in South Asia. It was established in 1932 and regular classes started in 1933. Eminent scholars and historians like Prof. Bruce, Prof. A.L. Garrett, Prof. Dennison Ross, Dr. A.L. Sirivastava, and Dr. Ishtiaq Hussain Qureshi remained associated with this Department before and after the establishment of Pakistan. Prof. Dilawar Hussain associated senior teachers from affiliated colleges of Lahore with the Department such as Prof. Mian Namdar, Prof. Fayyaz Ahmad and Dr. Abdul Hamid from Government College Lahore, Dr. Syed Zawwar Hussain Zaidi from Foreman Christian College, Prof. Shamsuddin, Prof. Abbas bin Abdul Qadir



and Prof. Ilm-ud-Din Salik from Islamia College Lahore, and Prof. Shujauddin from Dayal Singh College Lahore. At that time, there were no regular teachers in the Department.

In 1956, Dr. Zafarul-Islam joined the Department as senior lecturer, but he soon expired. Prof. Sh. Abdur Rashid, who had retired from Aligarh Muslim University (India), was also engaged in the Department along with Dr. Montgomery Hyde. Both these eminent historians of international fame gradually developed the Department to its full strength. Dr. Ijaz Hassan Qureshi, Prof. S. Ali Abbas, Prof. Dr. Yar Muhammad Khan, Prof. Ikram Ali Malik, Prof. Muhammad Aslam, Dr. Razaulhaq Shah, Prof. Dr. Sadiq Ali Gill, Prof. Syed Qamar Abbas, Mrs. Tahira Shah, Prof. Dr. S. Qalb-i-Abid and Prof. Dr. Iqbal Chawla served the Department with distinction.

The Department also availed the services of some Fulbright scholars like Prof John Westover and Reymond Moore from the U.S. and Dr. Peter Hardy of the School of Oriental and Africa Studies, University of London, who taught in this Department for a couple of years. The present faculty has also grown up to seniority, eminence and professional ability. This includes, Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Prof. Dr. Rukhsana Iftikhar, Prof. Dr. Tahir Mahmood, Prof. Dr. Faraz Anjum, Prof. Dr. Naumana Kiran, Mr. Ghazi Muhammad Abdullah and Dr. Maqbool Ahmad Awan.

Research activities in the Department are as old as the Department itself. Its research Journal, "Journal of the Punjab University Historical Society", was first published in 1911 under the name of



"Journal of Punjab Historical Society". It soon enjoyed international reputation as a premier historical journal from South Asia. In 2013, it was published after a gap of ten years and since then, it is being published regularly. Every effort is being made to regain its original scholarly research reputation. Keeping in view its contribution in the field of research Higher Education Commission has recognized the Journal in its list of HEC Recognized Journals. This is besides the individual research activities of the faculty.

CONDOLENCE REFERENCE FOR PROF. AHMED SAEED



Prof. Ahmed Saeed was a veteran historian of Pakistan and an alumnus of the Department who compiled more than 40 books on different aspects of Pakistan's history, particularly focussing on the pioneers of freedom movement. He died suddenly on January 13, 2021 which was a great loss for the historians' fraternity. The Department arranged a condolence reference on January 26 in which the family members, friends and students of Prof. Ahmed Saeed participated. Prof. Faraz Anjum conducted the proceedings while Prof. Syed Qamar Abbas, former Chairman of the Department chaired the session. Prof. Aurangzeb Alamgir, former Additional Registrar and Professor of Urdu, PU; Prof. Khalid Humayun, former Professor of Punjabi Deparment PU; Dr. Rizwan Ullah Kokab, Chairman Department of History, GCU Faisalabad; Mr. Ghazi Muhammad Abdullah of History Department PU; Dr. Irfan Waheed Usmani, from Government College University Lahore; Amir Raza Khan of City 42 News Channel and Dr. Raza Taimoor, Associate Professor of History, Government Science College Lahore spoke on the occasion and lauded the academic services of Prof. Ahmed Saeed.

They pointed out that it was due to his indomitable will and incessant hard work that despite unfavourable circumstances and limited resources, Prof. Ahmed Saeed was able to produce huge amount of historical work. From amongst his family, his daughter Dr. Shazia Seed, cousins Wajid sb and Tariq Ameer and grandson Abdul Momin spoke on the occasion and recollected the memories of Prof Ahmed Saeed. Prof. Mahboob Hussain also spoke on the occasion and gave the assurance that the Department would do everything in its capacity to complete the mission of Prof. Ahmed Saeed and his unfinished projects would be undertaken with full zeal and zest.

At the time of his death, Prof. Ahmed Saeed was working on his book on Lahore which was in the final stages of completion. Prof. sb had spent about ten years in collecting its material and it had rare information on the social and cultural history of the city. Prof. Mahboob Hussain undertook to publish it from the Department to which the family of Prof. sb agreed. On June 30th, an agreement was signed between Dr. Shazia Saeed and Prof. Mahboob Hussain for publishing the book Mahboob Hussain for publishing the book الاہور ایک شمیر بے مثال

PROFILE OF PROF. AHMED SAEED:

He was born on November 21, 1942 in East Punjab and did his BA in 1962 from Government College Lahore and MA History and Political Science from University of the Punjab. He opted for teaching profession and served as Chairman, Department of History, M.A.O. College Lahore (1967-1988) and Islamia College, Lahore (1989-1993). He was awarded the Presidential Medal of Pride of Performance on 23rd March 2016 for his research work about Quaid-e-Azam and Pakistan Movement. He also remained associated with Maulana Zafar Ali Khan Trust and undertook a huge project of editing Zamindar's editiorials. Till his death six volumes covering the period of 1923-24 have been published. His other important publications include Musulmanan-e Punjab ki Samaji aur Falahi Anjumanein; Islamia College, Lahore, 2 Vols.; Muslim India 1857-1947: A Biographical Dictionary; Reflections on Pakistan – Economic Aspect; Hayat-e-Quaid-i-Azam: Chand Naye Pehlu; Roznama Zamindar aur Tehrik-e-Azadi: Touzeehi Isharia; Bazm-e-Ashraf kai Chiragh; Quaid-i-Azam Muslim Press ki Nazar Main; The Eastern Times on Quaid-i-Azam; Guftar-i-Zafar Ali Khan; Trek to Pakistan.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON ZAHEER-UD-DIN MUHAMMAD BABUR



Zaheer-ud-Din Muhammad Babur, the founder of Mughal dynasty in South Asia, was an iconic figure who occupies a unique place in today's world as he is venerated not only in Indo-Pakistan Subcontinent but also in Central Asia and thus can be a bridge between these two geographical regions. To commemorate Zaheer-ud-Din Babur Day, the Department in collaboration with Punjab University Regional Integration Centre (RIC), the Embassy of the Republic of Uzbekistan to Pakistan & Center for Global & Strategic Studies (CGSS), Islamabad, arranged a conference titled "Legacy of Zaheer-ud-Din Mohammad Babur and Its Relevance in Contemporary Bilateral Relations between Pakistan and Uzbekistan". It was organized on Thursday February 11, 2021 at Al Raazi Hall.

In the Conference, Uzbekistan's Ambassador to Pakistan Mr Oybek Arif Usmanov, Pro Vice Chancellor Prof Dr Saleem Mazhar, Dean Faculty of Arts and Humanities Prof Dr Amra Raza, Centre for Global and Strategic Studies (CGSS) member board of experts Dr Mahmood ul Hasan, Executive Director Col (r) Khalid Taimur, Chairman PU Department of History and Pakistan Studies Prof Dr Mahboob Hussain, PU Institute of Communication Studies Director Prof Dr Noshina Saleem, PU College of Art and Design Principal Prof Dr Sumera Jawad, PU Regional Integration Centre Director Dr Fauzia Hadi Ali, University of Peshawar's Area Study Centre Director Prof. Dr. Shabir Ahmad Khan, PU's Dr Faraz Anjum, Dr Rukhsana Iftikhar, other faculty members and a large number of students participated in the conference. Addressing the conference, Uzbek Ambassador Mr Usmanov said that he was immensely impressed by the artwork of PU students in which they had truly reflected the culture of Uzbekistan in a creative manner. He said that the life of Zaheer uddin Babur could be a guideline to promote bilateral relations between the two countries and there were many cultural similarities. He said that Lahore was very dear to every Uzbek citizen.

He said that Uzbekistan wanted to promote socio-economic relations with Pakistan. He said that the establishment of a rail track from Tashkent to Peshawar would play an important role in the promotion of trade and people to people contact. He lauded PU VC Prof Niaz Ahmad for



establishment of RIC and promotion of the legacy of Zaheer uddin Babur in such a remarkable way. In his statement, PU VC Prof Niaz Ahmad said that PU would extend full cooperation to promote mutual relations with Uzbekistan's universities. He said that PU would play its role for strengthening regional cooperation among friendly countries and RIC had been established keeping in view this purpose.

Prof Vice Chancellor Prof Dr. Muhammad Saleem Mazhar in his remarks stated that PU would organize exchange programs for students and faculty. He said that promotion of bilateral relations between the two countries was a need of the hour and PU would play a lead role in this regard. In his address, Prof Dr Mahboob Hussain said that Zaheer-ud-din Babur was the first king who wrote an autobiography. He said that Babur invented Khat-e-Babri and he was also an excellent Sufi poet. He said that the life of Zaheer-ud-din Babur was a good source to promote strategic relations with Uzbekistan. He stated that a framework would be devised for academic exchange between PU and Universities in Uzbekistan to find out the relevance in the shared history for the study of the contemporary world. Dr. Mehmood ul Hassan Khan stated that Babur was the most captivating personality in the oriental history. He said that Babur created one of the most powerful empires in the history of the East and was the first one to establish a connection with the soil of Pakistan. Dr. Faraz Anjum highlighted the legacy which Babur bequeathed to his descendants and which served as an example for them to follow. He stated that Babur's personality became an example for the later rulers to follow. Dr. Rukhsana Iftikhar stated that Babur's life was documented more than any other figure before colonial rule in the subcontinent. Prof. Dr. Shabir Ahmad Khan stated that Babur was a man of extraordinary qualities. He was a leader, a soldier, an architect and an administrator. He said that Zaheer-ud-Din Babur was a lover of nature and he was the best in generating loyalty and devotion amongst his followers. RIC Director Dr Fauzia Hadi Ali said that the centre would organize activities to enhance regional cooperation. The conference highlighted the socio-cultural and historic legacy and common heritage of the two countries and avenues of cooperation and collaboration between Uzbekistan and Pakistan. A Documentary was also screened at the occasion on "Uzbekistan-Pakistan: Shared Cultural & Islamic History" which was produced by the students of the PU Institute of Communication Studies. The Uzbek ambassador and others visited the art exhibition organized by PU College of Art and Design. Shields and certificates were distributed among faculty members and students for their outstanding performance.

Earlier on, Uzbek Ambassador to Pakistan Oybek Arif Usmanov called on PU Vice Chancellor Prof Niaz Ahmed at his office to discuss enhancement of mutual cooperation among the universities of both the countries. A MoU was also signed between Punjab University and Uzbekistan's Tashkent State University for exchange of teachers, students and launching of joint research projects. On the occasion, PU VC Prof Niaz Ahmed announced to give scholarships to Uzbek students and invited them to study in Punjab University.

On 23rd February, first he was presented with gifts in the Department and then both faculty and staff moved to University Club where a sumptuous lunch was arranged for him. He was bidden adieu with lots of prayers and wishes for his future life and good health.

Annual Sports Gala

After a drudgery atmosphere of Covid-19 and dry days of studies and exams, the first week of March was a week of jubilation and 'halla gulla' in the Department. On 3rd March, Sports Gala started in the Department. Prof. Faraz Anjum, as student advisor, coordinated all the activities. The Department was decorated with balloons, ribbons and colourful papers. In the morning of



3rd March, Prof. Mahboob Hussain with other teachers inaugurated the sports by cutting the ribbon. All the teachers encouraged the students by playing cricket, football, badminton and table tennis. Indoor games were also played and the whole day was spent in competitions. The students enthusiastically participated in indoor and outdoor sports.

On 4th March, tugs of war (rassa kashi) were fought between the students of History and Pakistan Studies in the ground of the Department with a lot of charged emotions. First the boys tested their physical strength and then the turn of girls came. The teachers supervised the 'war' as the atmosphere was charged with emotions. STUDY TOUR TO ROHTAS FORT



On 7th March, the Department arranged a study tour of the students to the historical Rohtas Fort which is a 16th-century fortress located near the city of Jehlum. The two University buses were jam-packed with the students and staff members. Prof. Mahboob Hussain, Prof. Tahir Mehmood and Prof. Faraz Anjum accompanied the tour. The journey started from Lahore at about 9.00 am in the morning and after covering a distance of about 200 kms reached Rohtas Fort at about 2.00 pm. It was decided to take lunch first and then to go for excursion. Professor Faraz Anjum briefed the students about the historical importance of the Fort. The fort is one of the largest and most formidable in the subcontinent.

It was never stormed by force, and has survived remarkably intact. The fortress was built by Raja Todar Mal on the orders of Sher Shah Suri, partly to suppress the local Gakhar tribes of then Potohar region. The fort has 12 gateways and the Sohail gate features some of the best masonry work of the Sur Empire, and was likely the ceremonial main entrance to the fort. It derives its name from a local saint named Sohail Bukhari and the Kabuli gate derives its name from the fact that it opens towards the northwest in the general direction of Kabul. The students took keen interest in the history and archaeological remains of the Fort. The return journey started at about 5.00 pm and buses reached the department at about 10.30 p.m. During the journey the students entertained themselves with music and dancing. It was both a joyful and informative tour.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON "AZERBAIJAN'S RECONSTRUCTION TO RECONNECT: A WAY FORWARD"



On 8th March 2021, an Online International Conference was organized on "Azerbaijan's Reconstruction to Reconnect: A Way Forward". This conference was jointly organized by Regional Integration Center, University of the Punjab, Lahore, ADA University, Azerbaijan, and Center for Global & Strategic Studies (CGSS), Islamabad. The conference aimed to discuss the possible ways and means to facilitate the process of reconstruction and mega infrastructural development in the liberated areas of Azerbaijan.

Mr. Fariz Ismailzade, Executive Vice-Rector, ADA University, Baku, Azerbaijan highlighted that during his visit to Pakistan, he firsthand witnessed the strategic importance of Pakistan and its potential in the region. Pakistan and Azerbaijan have cooperation's in multiple fields like education, diplomacy, and think tank

cooperation as well. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Chairman of Department of History and Pakistan Studies, University of Punjab, Lahore briefly shared the history behind the Armenia and Azerbaijan conflict. Armenia breached the ceasefire contract and attacked civilians and Azerbaijan Armed forces breaking several humanitarian accords.

Dr. Mehmood-Ul-Hassan Khan, Regional Geo-Political Analyst & Member Board of Experts, CGSS highlighted the atrocities committed by Armenia. Prof. Dr. Iram Khalid, Chairperson of Political Science Department, University of Punjab, Lahore highlighted that regional connectivity is gaining more and more importance. Dr. Adam Saud, Dean, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences of Bahria University, Islamabad highlighted that Armenia's destruction and aggression have destroyed the cultural heritage and history of Azerbaijan. Prof. Azer Babayev, ADA University, Baku, Azerbaijan that this occupation by Armenia is one of the longest occupations. Dr. Marium Kamal, Assistant Professor, South Asian Studies Center, University of Punjab, Lahore discussed the security dilemmas involved in the reconstruction and rehabilitation of liberated areas..The conference was moderated by Ms. Palwasha Nawaz, Project Executive, CGSS, and was attended by experts and analysts from Azerbaijan and Pakistan. The conference was also viewed live by 300 viewers on social media platforms.

WEBINAR ON NEW PUBLIC MANAGEMENT AND THE ROLE OF CIVIL BUREAUCRACY IN PAKISTAN



Department of Political Science, the Islamia University of Bahawalpur organized a webinar on New Public Management and the Role of Civil Bureaucracy in Pakistan. Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Chairman, Department of History and Pakistan Studies, University of the Punjab, Lahore discussed the role of bureaucracy through the historical perspective of Pakistan. He discussed that bureaucracy in Pakistan has been politicized over the past few decades. Similarly, Political leadership and civil bureaucracy needs to develop a transparent and effective partnership for promoting public interest and ensuring human governance. He added that civil service is the profession where the civil servants are expected to work for the welfare of the society, for the welfare of the citizens, bureaucracy should not have only

managerial professionalism it should have ethical dimension as well. Welfare of the citizens is the very important part of the bureaucratic setup. Engr. Prof. Dr. Athar Mahboob, Vice Chancellor Dr. Aamir Saeed, Assistant Professor, Institute of Administrative Sciences, University of the Punjab, Lahore. At the end of the session, Prof. Dr. Syed Mussawar Hussain, Chairman Political Science department, IUB also talked in the webinar.

INTERNATIONAL VIRTUAL CONFERENCE ON "Emerging Trends in the Arts and Humanities"



The Faculty of Arts and Humanities, University of Punjab, Lahore, comprising of 8 academic departments, including Department of History and Pakistan Studies, hosted its first International Virtual Conference entitled, "Emerging Trends in the Arts and Humanities". Conference Chair Prof Dr Amra Raza, Dr Anjum Sabri, Dr Mahboob Hussain, Dr Muhammad Saeed, Dr Sumera Jawad, Dr Muhammad Hameed, Dr Shamaila Dodhy, Mr. Shahid Mahmood Gul, Dr Zafar Iqbal Butt, Dr Saleha Nazeer and Imran Qureshi were present on the occasion.

In her welcome address, Dr Amra stated that progress in education and research is mostly evaluated in quantitative terms such as CGPAs, rankings, and research publications. This conference aims to highlight the qualitative contribution to human growth and progress achieved through the pursuit of disciplines such as Philosophy, Archaeology, History, English Studies, French, South Asian, and Pakistan Studies as well as Sports Education, and Fine Arts. She elaborated that these disciplines focus on Emotional Quotient (EQ) development, which is very significant in a world of war, instability, pandemics, conflict and strife. She said that the success of our children should not only be measurable in CGPAs or A grades, but in terms of the human values nurtured by our institutions. Unity must safeguard diversity, and tolerance must protect the minority. Thus, the Arts and Humanities could forge a mutual coexistence and a respect for the natural world.

In this interdisciplinary conference, Prof. Ian Talbot, Head of History, University of Southampton and Prof. Matthew McCartney, Director of South Asian Programme, University of Oxford were the two keynote speakers of history discipline. Prof. Talbot's talk focused on "The History of British Diplomacy in Pakistan: Themes and Insights" while Prof. McCartney discussed "CPEC and Pakistan: The Creation of a New Asian Miracle Economy." Prof. Mahboob Hussain chaired a session on "Institutions, Education and Decolonization" in which Prof. Naumana Kiran presented her paper entitled, "Composition and Working of the Federal Cabinet during Zia ul Haq, 1977-1988."

UPLIFTING OF DEPARTMENT'S LIBRARY

Libraries play the most vital role in education and learning. A student of the Punjab University is fortunate in the sense that s/he becomes entitled to huge library resources, at least member of two libraries, Punjab University Library (often referred to as the Main Library) and the Department's Library. The Library of the History Department has in recent months seen some new positive developments. Its collection of



books and journals has reached a staggering number of 22000 Which include many rare as well as latest books. About 800 books have been added in this academic session only. On June 15, family of a dear alumnus Hasan Riaz (Session 2003-2005, MA Pakistan Studies) donated his collection of books, comprising of about 500 volumes. Hasan had the passion for reading books and he used to purchase rare and important books on history and literature. Remembering the Pioneers of the Department Sheikh Abdur Rashid, Chairman (1961-1964)

He was born on November 6, 1898 in Pindi Bhattian and did his graduation from Islamia College Lahore. Then in 1924, he got his Masters in History and degree in Law from Aligarh Muslim University where he came under the influence of veteran historian Professor Muhammad Habib. Later he joined History Department, Aligarh University as a teacher and remained its Chairman from 1950 till his retirement in 1958. He shifted to Lahore in 1959 and joined the History Department, Punjab University. In 1961, he was appointed as Honorary Head of the Department which position, he continued to hold till his resignation in June1965. Then he shifted to Karachi where for next six years, he taught in the Karachi University. When in 1971, veteran historian Dr. A.H. Dani was given the responsibility to establish Departments of History and Archaeology in University of Islamabad (now Quaid-i-Azam University), he asked Prof. Abdur Rasheed to teach there which he did for a couple of years. He also donated his personal collection of books to the Library of University of Islamabad.



Prof. Sheikh Abdur Rasheed can be considered as the real founder of the Department after the creation of Pakistan. Till his appointment, Department was working on adhoc basis with hardly any permanent teachers. Teaching was done in the Department by adjunct faculty either visiting teachers from nearly affiliated colleges or foreign British and American Professors who joined the Department for one year term. Through the efforts of Sheikh Abdur Rasheed, Dr. Yar Muhammad Khan, Syed Ali Abbas and Ikram Ali Malik joined the Department on permanent basis. Then he established Historical Research Institute and Research Society of Pakistan (with the assistance of his close relative and prominent historian Sheikh Muhammad Ikram) through which he trained a number of young historians, including M.Rafique Afzal, Ikram Ali Malik, Zawwar Husain Zaid, Sher Muhammad Grewal and Ahmed Saeed. He remained Director of Historical Research Institute from 1961 to 1965 while he remained Advisor of Research Society for eight years from 1964 to 1972.

Sheikh Abdur Rasheed was not just an exceptional teacher but also a researcher and a historian par excellence who edited a number of important Persian sources of Medieval India. He chaired a number of sessions of Indian History Congress and Pakistan History Conference and delivered thought provoking presidential addresses. He died on January 10, 1994 in Karachi at the age of 96 years. Prof. Irfan Habib wrote in the obituary note of his teacher in *Proceedings of Indian History Congress* that "his lectures on the Delhi Sultanate would be long remembered by all his students who had the privilege of hearing them. It remained a matter of regret that these were never given a written form and published. He endeavoured to support in Pakistan the tradition of a critical source-based history at which he was most at home." His notable publications include:

PUBLICATION OF PROF. Ahmed Saeed's Book

Prof. Ahmed Saeed was a veteran historian of Pakistan who died on January 13, 2021. At the time of his death, he was compiling a two volume study of socio-cultural history of Lahore for which he had spent about a decade. As he was an a l u m n u s of the



Department and had strong attachment with it, Prof. Mahboob took the initiative and the Department took the responsibility to publish his book which came out in August on the eve of the Day of Independence of Pakistan. It was a befitting tribute to Professor Ahmed Saeed's memory who was a devout Pakistani. The book is an original contribution to the socio-cultural history of Lahore as it focuses on those rare aspects which have not been touched upon by earlier writers.

ROUNDTABLE ON THE QUAID-I-AZAM

The Independence Day this year was celebrated in the Department in a unique manner. On 17th August, young scholars were invited to talk on the topic "Quaid-i-Azam's Vision and Today's



Pakistan." Dr. Ghulam Shabbir from University of Gujarat, Mr. Khizar Jawad from Forman Christian College (University), Ms. Sabah Mushtaq from Kinnaird College for Women University, Dr. Raza Taimur of Government Science College Wahdat Road, and Dr. Adnan Tariq from Government Islamia College Civil Lines Lahore spoke on different aspects of the topic. ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION AND VISIT OF Uzbekistan's Ambassador



On 12th October 2021, a Roundtable Discussion on "Central-South Asia Regional Connectivity: Grand Initiative by His Excellency President Shavkat Mirziyoyev" was jointly organized by Center for Global & Strategic Studies, Islamabad & Department of History & Pakistan Studies, University of the Punjab in collaboration with Embassy of the Republic of Uzbekistan, Islamabad & Regional Integration Center, University of the Punjab. Prof. Dr. Muhammad Saleem Mazhar, Pro Vice-Chancellor of the University in his opening remarks stated that Punjab University is one the oldest university and the Department of History has created many scholars and professors. Punjab University has offered admissions to the students of Uzbekistan that will prove to be a milestone in Pak-Uzbek bilateral ties. Brigadier Mansoor Saeed Sheikh (Retd), Vice President (Punjab Region), (CGSS), in his welcome address stated that Pakistan is situated at the convergence of three geoeconomically significant regions and it offers shortest route to the sea for all landlocked countries of Central Asia alongside western China and Afghanistan. Pakistan stands out significantly in this regional connectivity. Prof. Dr. Iram Khalid, Chairperson, Department of Political Science & International Relations, talked about "Reinvigorating the phenomena of academic cooperation into regionalism: A case study of Central & South Asia". She presented a model that included activities like student



exchange programs, seminars, conferences and expert exchange programs. Prof. Dr. Rukhsana Iftikhar, spoke on "Economic Potential Between Central and South Asia". She stated that since the freedom of South Asian states, Pakistan has also been trying to promote her relations with these newly born states. Pakistan has been a gateway to Central Asia for centuries.

Dr. Fozia Ali Hadi, Director, Regional Integration Center talked about the "Role of SCO in Central & South Asia Connectivity". REMEMBERING OUR PIONEERS: Professor Yar Muhammad Khan

Professor Dr Yar Muhammad Khan, Ex-Chairman, the Department of History and Dean, Faculty of Arts University of the Punjab Lahore was one of the eminent scholars and historians of Pakistan. He remained Chairman of the Department from 1969 to 1973 and then from 1979 till the date of his retirement on 1st February 1990. He, thus, spent the longest period as Chairman of the Department.

Prof. Yar Muhammad Khan was born on February 1, 1929 in Jalandhar. After migration, his family lived in Sialkot. He got his Master's degree in the subject of History from University of the Punjab in 1953. Then he proceeded abroad for higher education and took Master's degree from University of London in 1956 and did Doctorate from the same university in 1958. He then joined Sindh University for a short period of



time and then moved to History Department, University of the Punjab. He had been attached to the teaching profession since 1953 till his death. He also taught for one year in Western Illinois University, Macomb, USA and Oregon State University, Corvallis, USA. After his retirement, he went to Mecca for performing Hajj and died there due to cardiac arrest on 20th May 1992.

His publications include three books and thirty research articles published in journals of international repute including six articles contributed to *Encyclopedia of Islam*, Lahore. A list of his books is as under:

BOOK TALK: THE PUNJAB BORDERLAND MOBILITY, MATERIALITY AND MILITANCY 1947-1987 BY DR ILYAS CHATTHA

The Department of History and Pakistan Studies arranged a talk on the book entitled *The Punjab Borderland Mobility, Materiality and Militancy 1947-1987* by the author of the book Dr Ilyas Chattha. He is currently based at LUMS. Previously, he has been associated with The Centre for Imperial and Post-Colonial Studies at the University of Southampton, United Kingdom. His earlier work was a micro-level study that examines the 1947 Partition violence, refugees' experiences, and urban regeneration in the Pakistan Punjab. It was during the field work for his first work when Dr Chattha found initial material for



his second book. The new book is a path-breaking work on Punjab Borderland and provides important insights into how the new international boundary between India and Pakistan was made, subverted and transformed between 1947 to 1987. It is published by Cambridge University Press, UK. During the talk, Dr Chattha provided the students a brief overview of the book and encouraged the research students to spend time in archives and other repositories of historical sources to explore and write lesser-known histories.

SEMINAR ON KASHMIR: PROBLEMS AND PROSPECTS



Kashmir Issue has been a major bone of contention between India and Pakistan. While claims of India over Kashmir are grounded in legality of the accession of Kashmir with the Indian Union, Pakistan believes that the creation of Pakistan is incomplete without Kashmir. Pakistan, therefore, has been an active supporter of Kashmiri resistance against Indian occupation by highlighting Indian atrocities at

international forums. As part of solidarity with Kashmiris, the commemoration of Kashmir Day on 5th of February every year is a national event in Pakistan. In this connection, a seminar was organised by Ibn-i-Khaldun Society of the Department of History & Pakistan Studies on February 07, 2022. The seminar was started with the Recitation of Holy Quran. A Kashmiri folk song was sung. It was followed by the welcome speech of Muhammad Yasir, the President, Ibn-e-Khaldoon society. Prof. Dr. Khwaja Zahid Aziz, Chairman, Department of Kashmir Studies, University of the Punjab was invited as guest speaker for the event. Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain Chairman Presided over the event. Ibn-i-Khaldun Society of the Department of History & Pakistan Studies organized an event to mark the International Mother Languages Day. The prime objective of the event was to make the students aware about the importance of their mother tongues and regional languages. It was attended by the



department faculty and students. It was presided over by Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Chairman of the Department. The event started off with recitation of the holy Quran. WEBINAR: CPEC Transforms Pakistan's Economy: Lessons From History

The Department of History & Pakistan Studies organized a webinar on "CPEC Transforms Pakistan's Economy: Lessons from History." The guest speaker was Professor Mathew MacCartney from the United Kingdom. Prof. McCartney spent twenty years as an academic working in one of the most prestigious institutions of higher learning including the School of African and Oriental Studies (SOAS), University of London, and the University of Oxford. He is a development economist with specialization in economic development of India and Pakistan.

He has published eight books and numerous research articles. His latest book, The Dragon from the Mountains: The CPEC from Kashqar to Gawadar was published by Cambridge University Press, UK in 2021. In his talk on CPEC's impact on Pakistan's economic transformation, Prof. McCartney explained why the support for CPEC in Pakistan is widespread and encompasses much of academia, the military, the mainstream political leadership, and civil society. Supporters, according to the speaker, argue that CPEC offers the potential to transform Pakistan and support rapid, equitable and sustainable economic growth. Detractors of CPEC argue that it will more likely tip Pakistan into a dependent debt-relationship with China and that it will facilitate more Chinese imports into Pakistan posing a threat to Pakistan's industrial base.

The talk was followed by a question answer session. In the end, Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Chairman of the Department, thanked Prof. McCartney for the very informative talk and hoped that Department of History will continue to organize such Webinar in the future.

SEMINAR ON: CREATION OF PAKISTAN AND THE Role of Provinces



Ibn-i-Khaldun society with the collaboration of History Forum of the Department organised a well-attended seminar to highlight the role of different provinces of British India in the creation of Pakistan. It was presided over by Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Chairman of the Department. Aqsa Basheer, an M.Phil. student of the department, moderated this event. Another book talk was organised by the department on recently published monograph *Islam in South Asia*. It was a wellattended and an insightful talk. Dr. Jamal Malik, the author of the book and Professor at Erfurt University Germany along with Prof Dr Tahir Kamran from Beaconhouse National University and Dr Muhammad Raghib Hussain, Principal Jamia Naeemia Lahore, spoke on the occasion. Prof Jamal Malik highlighted the salient features of his book and told the audience about the inspiration behind writing this book. Prof Dr Tahir Kamran in his talk congratulated the author

for focussing on intellectual, cultural, and social aspects of Islamic history of South Asia. Dr Raghib Naeemi discussed the role of Sufis and religious seminaries in spreading and preaching of Islam in South Asia. He highlighted the importance of creating a balance between true Islamic perspective and cultural norms of the society in South Asia. There was also a question answer session. In the end Dr Mahboob Hussain, Chairperson department of History and Pakistan Studies, shared his views about the book.

NATIONAL HISTORY WORKSHOP: "Emerging Trends in History Writing & Teaching"

For the department of History and Pakistan Studies, the main highlight of the first half of the year 2022 was the one-day National History Workshop. It was held on 28th of March 2022. The prime objectives of the workshop were to highlight the importance of the subject of history, to explore and deliberate on emerging trends in historiography and teaching, to establish connection and promote cooperation among historians who are attached with the discipline of history in Pakistan and beyond, to revitalise the discipline of history on local and national level, and to provide opportunity



to young Ph.D. and M. Phil scholars to learn the art of history writing and teaching. The workshop was inaugurated by the Punjab University Pro Vice Chancellor Professor Dr. Saleem Mazhar along with Dean Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences Professor Dr Amra Raza, and chairperson Punjab University History Department, Professor Dr Mahboob Hussain. The inaugural session was moderated by Professor Dr Faraz Anjum. In his inaugural speech, Professor Dr Saleem Mazhar said progress in the fields of science and technology is never complete without a parallel development in social sciences. Both sciences and social sciences go hand in hand to develop a better future. The role of history in this regard, according to him, is critical. He said the subject of history can also be influential in fostering Pakistan's relations with neighbouring countries. Specifically highlighting the significance of Persian language in the history of Sub-continent, he urged the participants to use classical Persian sources to revive and forge linkages between Pakistan and Central Asia. He congratulated Chairperson Dr Mahboob Hussain and his faculty members for organizing such a workshop to promote the subject of history.

Dr Amra Raza said the history is much more than just an outline of facts. She said that there was a need to promote academic collaboration between the fields of history, philosophy, and literature. Dr Mahboob Hussain, in his welcome speech, gave a brief introduction of the Department of History and Pakistan Studies, University of the Punjab. He said that the department was the oldest in South Asia. It was established in 1932 with J.F. Bruce as its first ever chairperson. Ever since, the department has been a prestigious seat of historical studies. He said that the subject of history was not given the importance it deserved in schools and colleges. He said that the workshop would provide a platform to Pakistani historians to deliberate on new trends in history writing and explore ways to work jointly. After the inaugural session, the participants read their individual papers in two parallel sessions. The theme of the academic session A was *Politics, Institutions, and Historical Sources*.

The academic session B was about Subalterns, Ideas, and New Tropes of History. In each session eight papers were read. After individual presentations, lunch was being served. In the second half, all participants joined together in a round table sitting to discuss and highlight important outcomes of the workshop. At the end, delegates unanimously favoured the recommendations to (a) organise regular history conferences and seminars on rotation basis, (b) establish a representative body of Pakistani historians. The name of the body could be "National History Forum" or "Pakistan History Society". The body will not be responsible to organise regular conferences and seminars but also to devise a mechanism to share list of topics that are being researched in each and every History department across Pakistan. New topics will also be shared annually to avoid repetition. An interim four membered committee was formed under Prof. Dr. Mahboob, Chairperson, Department of



History & Pak. Studies, University of the Punjab, along with Dr Rizwan Ullah Kokub, Dr Moiz Khan, and Dr Fakhar Bilal, to draft the constitution of the proposed representative body. It was also agreed that on the 75th anniversary of the foundation of Pakistan, a special document will be prepared which will include dissertations of students from different universities and colleges. The participants lauded the efforts of Punjab University Department of History & Pakistan Studies for organizing a fruitful workshop.



PHD Awarded

Mr Muhammad Sohail Yousaf successfully defended his Ph.D. public viva and was awarded Ph.D. degree. The title of his PhD dissertation was "Politics of Incoherence: Factionalism in the Punjab Muslim League (1907-1954). He completed his thesis under the supervision of Prof. Mahboob Hussain, Prof. Dr. Muhammad Shafique Bhatti from BZU, Multan and Prof. Dr. Farooq Ahmad Dar from QAU, Islamabad, were the examiners. He presented his ten volumes book on Sikh History to the Chairman of the department Dr Mahboob Hussain for the department's seminar library. The department arranged a dinner in the honour of Dr Dilgeer at the Punjab University Executive Club.



SPECIAL LECTURE OF PROF. WAEL HALLAQ: THE Ethics of Empire and Wealth: Ibn Khaldun and the Modern State

Well known historian Prof. Ikram Ali Malik, former Chairman Department of History, Punjab

University wrote an important book entitled *Truth is Truth: A Rejoinder to Abdul Wali Khan*. It is clearly based on rare primary documents. The book was published 32 years ago in 1990 and was out of print. Talking about why there was a need to reprint this book, Prof. Dr Mahboob Hussain told that when he assumed the charge of the department as Chairman, he got a call from a senior journalist who wanted to see this rare book for one of his stories. A search of the department's library revealed that only one copy of the book was available. Realizing its importance, it was decided to republish this book so that it would be available in the market.

PHD SEMINARS

Ph.D. seminars are a regular academic activity in which research scholars present their work before the faculty and other research students of the department. It is also a HEC-mandated requirement of their degree. This activity helps them to get feedback from an academic audience to fine tune their arguments before the final submission of their dissertations. REMEMBERING OUR PIONEERS: PROFESSOR MUHAMMAD ASLAM (1932-1998)



He was a distinguished historian of Pakistan who excelled in the history of medieval India. Born on November 28, 1932 at the town of Phillaur in District Jalandhar, East Punjab in United India, he was educated in Lahore and did his graduation from Islamia College, Lahore, where he was mentored by such teachers like Mian Shams al-Din and Professor Hameed Ahmad Khan. He was also patronized by Prof. Muhammad Shuja al-Din who had a great influence and impact on his personality. He, then, got admitted in the Department of History, University of the Punjab, Lahore from where he did his Masters in History in 1955. After that, he went to

Muslim University, Aligarh to pursue higher studies in history but soon came back as he could not adjust himself in the new environment. After coming back from Aligarh, he got admission in Karachi University where he started conducting research on the Mughal Emperor Shahjahan. However, without completing his studies, he left for England for higher studies. He got admission in Durham University, from where he did BA Honours in Islamic and Arabic Studies in 1960. In 1962, he completed his Masters in history from Manchester University, where he wrote a Master's thesis on Shaykh Ahmad Sirhindi. At Cambridge University, he studied under the mentorship of world-renowned scholars including A. J. Arberry (d. 1969). He spent four years there, and conducted research on the political thought of a Muslim luminary, Fazl Ullah ibn Ruzbihan Isfahani (d. 1209) and in 1967 he was awarded the degree of M.Litt.

Prof. Aslam joined the Department of History, PU Lahore as a lecturer in September 1967. He served the Department for almost thirty-five years, and worked as Professor and twice as Head of the Department from January 1973 to December 1974 and then from 1990 to 1992. Even after his retirement from the University in 1992, he continued to serve the department as a visiting faculty member.

Prof. Aslam got himself initiated in the Chishti-Sabiri Silsilah during the last years of his life at the hand of Mawlana Shah Abrar al-Hagg Chishti of Radauli, who was a *khalifa* of celebrated sufi, Mawlana Ashraf Ali Thanvi (b.1863-d.1943). He died on October 6, 1998 and was buried in Miyani Sahib Graveyard in Lahore. His daughter, Dr. Tanvir Anjum is presently serving as Professor at the Department of History, Quaid-i-Azam University, Islamabad. Prof. Aslam richly contributed to the discipline of history by his prolific writings on varied aspects of history. His academic works included books, and articles which appeared in leading research journals, magazines and newspapers of India and Pakistan from 1957 till his death in 1998. He mostly wrote in Urdu language. One of his greatest strengths as a historian was his indepth knowledge of Arabic and Persian languages, which enabled him to directly undertake the study of manuscripts of medieval historiographical, sufi and other genres of literature without relying on their translations. 3-day International Conference on "South Asia@ 75: past, Present and Future Organized by Department of History and Pakistan Studies

The key highlight of the year 2022 was the Three-Day International Conference on 'South Asia@75: Past, Present, and Future'. The mega event was held between 26th and 28th of October 2022. The prime objective of the conference was to see how future of South Asia could be predicted based on the lessons learned during the last seventy-five years. In total, the department received 250 abstracts from Pakistan and abroad. Out of which 127 papers were being accepted to create coherent panels on various themes and aspects of South Asian history



and politics. Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, chairman Department of History and Pakistan Studies University of the Punjab, warmly welcomed the worthy guests for the inaugural ceremony. It was inaugurated by chief guest Prof. Dr Shahid Munir, Chairperson Punjab Higher Education Commission. He said that the countries of South Asia must learn from past mistakes and make new agreements to move forward and develop their nations. On this occasion, Dean Faculty of Arts and Humanities Prof Dr Amra Raza, Dr Iftikhar Ahmed Malik of Oxford University, Dr Sara Ansari from University of London (online), Convener of Parliamentary Research Group Zafarullah Khan, faculty members, students and researchers from all over the world participated. Dr Iftikhar Ahmad Malik said that there are numerous institutions for higher education in Pakistan, but good research must be promoted to improve the quality of education. He said that to promote quality education in Pakistan's public and private universities, an atmosphere of competition must be created because without it the process of development is inevitable. Dr Sarah Ansari discussed the history of South Asia. Zafarullah Khan said that there has been a lack of communication between the countries of South Asia. He said that Pakistan and Bangladesh have gone through the experiences of good and bad democracies. Dr Amra Raza while thanking the distinguished guests congratulated the organizers for organizing such an impressive conference.

Prof. Dr Mahboob Hussain welcomed the worthy guests for coming to the closing ceremony. He said that 17 sessions were held in the three-day international conference in which more than 100 delegates from India, Turkey, China, UK and Pakistan presented thier research papers. He highlighted the recommendations made in the light of the research papers presented in the conference:



The scholars have unanimously resolve that in the past 75 years, the region of South Asia has lagged behind in human and social development due to political, cultural and social conflicts, both in the nature of inter and intra-state, and which have seriously hampered and created hurdles in the way of prosperity and progress of the region. In order to create an environment friendly, for resolving these conflicts, the conference recommended that people to people contact should be encouraged at all

levels, academic, cultural and intellectual exchanges among the people of different states of the region should be promoted and encouraged. The conference recommended that Bangladesh, Pakistan and India, being share-holders of rich cultural, literary, historical and archaeological heritage of thousands of years, must work together to explore this heritage. The participants agreed that joint collaborative projects, such as in the areas of art and architecture, history-writing and archaeology should also be launched. The moot recommended that the looming environmental crises, particularly the dwindling water resources, are seriously impacting the people of South Asia and there is a strong need to join hands to combat the harmful effects of environmental change as no single country with its meagre resources can counter such change singlehandedly. The conference endorsed its resolve that peace and harmony, instead of war and confrontation, provides windows of opportunity for developing the human potential of South Asian people and for asserting themselves as civilized people of the world. The researchers said that forces of extremism and liberalism are bound to fail and an era of human progress and prosperity would ultimately dawn on the people of South Asian.

Prof Dr Hassan Askari, Former Caretaker Chief Minister of Punjab, was the chief guest of the closing ceremony. He said that the South Asian region could not highlight its positive identity in the world despite being the guardian of old and new civilizations, historical buildings and cultural heritage. He said that tension in India-Pakistan relations was an obstacle in bringing South Asian countries closer. Chairman Higher Education Commission of Pakistan Prof. Dr Mukhtar Ahmed also addressed the closing ceremony of the 3-day international conference on '75 years of South Asia: Past, Present and Future' online organized by Punjab University Department of History and Pakistan Studies in Al Raazi Hall. He said that the countries of South Asia must take steps for educational diplomacy for the development of the region. He also said that research conducted in universities should identify problems and provide solutions. In addition to this, His Excellency Mr. Yarzhan Kistafin Kazakhstan's Ambassador to Pakistan, and Mr. Aybek Arif Usmanov Uzbekistan's Ambassador to Pakistan took the privilege to speak on the importance of bilateral relations and regional connectivity. While speaking online, Yerzan Kustafin and Aybak Arif Usmanov called for strengthening people-to-people ties and South Asia for the development of the region.

Remembering our Pioneers: **Ikram Ali Malik** (1939-2005)



Born in August 1939 at Lahore, he got his early education at Government High School, Sheran Wala Gate, and later at Government College Lahore. He then did his Masters in history from Department of History, University of the Punjab. He did his B.A. Honours from School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London. In 1962, he started his academic career as a research assistant in the Institute of Historical Research which had been established by Professor Sheikh Abdur Rashid in the Department of History, University of the Punjab. Later he joined the Department as Lecturer. He twice served as Chairman of the Department in 1975-76 and 1992-96. He got retired as Professor of History in October 1998. In 1999, he donated his personal collection to the Library of the Department. He died in 2005.

CHINA VISIT BY DELEGATION OF THE DEPARTMENT



From June 15 to 28, 2023, a delegation of 9 Professors and PhD scholars from the Department of History & Pakistan Studies, Punjab University (PU) paid a friendly visit to different universities in China. It is the first visit to China after the end of the three-year COVID19 period. The delegation was led by Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Chairman of the Department, and included Prof. Dr. Rukhsana Iftikhar, Prof. Dr. Faraz Anjum, PhD scholars, Amna Latif, Noreen Fatima, Muhammad Usman Janjua, Abdul Sattar, Aqsa Zafar and Chinese PhD scholar Cheng Linsheng During this visit, the delegation had exchanges and communications with Chinese universities such as North-eastern University at Qinhuangdao (NEUQ), Yunnan Normal University (YNNU), and Inner Mongolia Honder College of Arts and Sciences (IMHCAS).

The first stop was NEUQ. Since the establishment of cooperation between PU and NEUQ in May 2018, the department has admitted 4 sessions of Chinese doctoral students, of which 35 PhD scholars have completed registration. According to the MOU between the two universities and long-term communication, the two-week visit to China was finally determined. During the visit, Professors of the department discussed MOU-related matters with NEUQ. Professors and PhD scholars of the two universities also exchanged and discussed overseas study, postgraduate training and academic research interests.



During the period, Prof. Dr. Rukhsana Iftikhar was invited to give lectures on "Cultural Heritages in Pakistan" to the teachers and students in YNNU, which was very meaningful for them to know and understand Pakistan. In addition, a PhD Supervisor Workstation was established in YNNU, laying a solid



foundation for promoting cultural exchanges between Pakistan and China. During her visit to Beijing, she also visited the Pakistan Study Center of Peking University and the Palace Museum.

The delegation also visited IMHCAS and participated in the "China-Pakistan International Symposium on History and Culture". Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Prof. Dr. Faraz Anjum, PhD scholars Aqsa Zafar and Muhammad Usman Janjua did their presentations in the symposium. A lecture entitled "A Brief History of Pakistan from early times to present day: an Overview" was given by Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, which was held in the School of Foreign Languages, IMHCAS and contributed to the promotion of Pakistan-China relations and cultural and academic exchanges. Subsequently, the two parties signed a memorandum of understanding on future cooperation.

In addition, the delegation also visited China's historical and cultural relics, folk customs and museums. The delegation visited three sites of the Great Wall: Jiumenkou Water borne Great Wall in Suizhong City, Liaoning Province, The Dragonz Head Great Wall in Shanhaiguan, Qinhuangdao City, Hebei Province, Badaling Great Wall in Yanqing District, Beijing; visited Tiananmen Square and its surrounding cultural buildings; Visited the Chinese folk sea god belief temples; experienced the customs of ethnic minorities in Yunnan and Inner Mongolia; visited the China Numismatics Museum, Glass Museum, and other important sites.

REMEMBERING OUR PIONEERS

Prof. I. H. Qureshi is one of the leading historians of Pakistan and has been hailed as the creator of a "master-narrative for the history of Pakistan." He was born at Patiali, a small town in U.P. in 1902. He first got education in Muslim University Aligarh but later did M.A. History and M.A. Persian from St. Stephens College, Delhi. Because of his outstanding performance, he was appointed lecturer in St. Stephens College. He did his PhD from University of Cambridge writing his dissertation on the administration of the Sultans of Delhi. In Cambridge, he got associated with Chaudhry Rehmat Ali's Pakistan National Movement. After his return to India in 1940, he joined the Delhi University as Lecturer, later promoted to be Chairman of the Department



Reader and then Professor. As Pakistan Movement was in full swing in (1948-1949)

those days, he fully supported the cause of All-India Muslim League and wrote many pamphlets as part of Pakistan Literature Series, including "The Development of Islamic Culture in India" and "The Future Development of Islamic Polity" in support of the demand for Pakistan. He developed close relations with Muslim League leadership and he was given Muslim ticket for contesting the 1946 elections for a Muslim seat from Bengal for the Central Legislative Assembly. As he won the elections, he was an eyewitness to the cataclysmic events resulting in the partition of India and creation of Pakistan. During the riots in Delhi, his house was surrounded and his library was burnt which had rare collection of history books and manuscripts. He with his family had to take refuge in Pakistan Embassy in Delhi and from there, he migrated to Pakistan.

After coming to Pakistan, in November 1948, he got selected as Professor of History in University of the Punjab and he also became Head of the Department. However, he could continue with his academic work only for a few months as in February 1949, he was called by the Prime Minister Liaguat Ali Khan and was appointed as Cabinet Minister. Till 1954, he held different ministerial portfolios. He also played a leading role in the negotiations which led to the passing of Objectives Resolution. In 1954 when the Constituent Assembly was dissolved, he joined Columbia University as Professor of South Asian History. His five years' tenure in Columbia was academically the most fruitful period of his life in which he wrote some of his most important works.

In 1960, he returned to Pakistan as head of the newly established Islamic Research Institute but in 1961, he was appointed as Vice Chancellor of Karachi University which he served till 1971. During this period, he worked for the preservation of the historical material related to Quaid-i-Azam and Pakistan Movement and for the establishment of Freedom Movement Archives. In 1979, he was appointed Chairman of the newly created National Language Authority. On 22nd January 1981, he died in Islamabad due to cardiac arrest. For a long period of time, he remained associated with Pakistan Historical Society and Pakistan Historical Records and Archives Commission. For his services, he was awarded Sitar-i-Pakistan and Nishan-i-Imtiaz by the Government of Pakistan. His important works of history include:

Remembering Our Pioneers Prof. Dr. Muhammad Aslam Syed (1946-2024)

Prof. Dr. Muhammad Aslam Syed was a prominent historian in the contemporary world, born on August 15, 1946. His family migrated from India to Pakistan during the partition. Dr. Syed earned his master's degree in history from the University of Punjab in 1968. He then pursued an MPhil and a PhD at Columbia University in New York, completing these degrees in January and May of 1978, respectively. While he possessed ordinary language skills, he was fluent in English, Urdu, and Punjabi, and he had expertise in translation and research in Persian, Arabic, French, and German.

Dr. Muhammad Aslam Syed began his professional career as a research scholar at the Pakistan Research Society in Lahore from 1968-1969. Shortly thereafter, he joined the Department of History at the University of Punjab in Lahore as a lecturer, a position he held until 1973. In that same year, he became a Lecturer in the Department of History at Quaid-i-Azam University in Islamabad, where he advanced from lecturer to professor between 1973 and 2003, achieving full professorship in 1987. During this time, he also served as a Quaid-i-Azam Distinguished Professor at Columbia University, where he earned his MPhil and PhD. Additionally, he was the Director of the National Institute of Historical and Cultural Research in Islamabad from 1996 to 1997.

From 1980 to 2003, Dr. Syed frequently delivered lectures as a visiting fellow at several prestigious universities, including: The South Asia Regional Studies at the University of Pennsylvania, the Centre for the Study of World Religions at Harvard University, the Department of Religion, at the City University of New York, and both Humboldt University and Freie Universitat in Berlin.

After retiring from Pakistan, he began an international journey dedicated to serving humanity through education. For nearly two decades, he worked at various international academic institutions, including the East-West Centre in Honolulu, Hawaii; the institut fur Asiatische und Afrikawissenschaften at Humboldt University in Berlin; and the International Consortium for Research in Humanities at Ruhr University in Bochum.

His research interests included transcultural historiography, Urdu literature, the relationship between Islam and the West, the Middle East and South Asia, Islamic mysticism and philosophy, the philosophy of history, as well as topics related to Afghanistan and Pakistan. Throughout his academic and professional career, he received various awards and honors, including: the Asia Foundation Fellowship (1975-78), the Presidential Award for Outstanding Academic Achievement at Columbia University (1977-78), the American Institute of Pakistan Studies Award (1980), the Senior Fulbright Award at Harvard University (1987-88), the Pakistan Television Award for Pride of Performance (2001), the Freeman Professorship at the University of Hawaii (2005), and the Mercator Professorship at Humboldt University in Berlin (2006-07). Additionally, he had the honor of representing Pakistan at the International Seminar on the Science of History organized by UNESCO in New Delhi (1987) and led the Pakistan delegation to Uzbekistan for the Anniversary Celebrations of Amir Taimur in 1997.

Dr. Aslam Syed presented his research at numerous national and international conference and seminars. His notable publications include:

EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO LAHORE MUSEUM (9TH JAN, 2025)



Students of MPhil History visited the Lahore Museum as part of their academic study under the supervision of Prof. Dr. Kiran Shahid Siddiqui. The students explored various galleries gaining hands-on experience with historical artifacts. This visit provided them with valuable insights into Pakistan's rich cultural heritage and helped them connect theoretical knowledge with practical observations. The students' curiosity and enthusiasm were evident as they engaged with museum staff and asked questions about the exhibits.

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY WITH DR. B. MARKUS DAECHSEL (14th Jan, 2025)

The Department hosted Dr. B. Markus Daechsel, Associate Professor of History at Royal Holloway, University of London (UK), for a thought-provoking and enriching talk on research methodology. During his session, Dr. Daechsel shared his deep expertise on navigating the complexities of historical research. He offered valuable guidance on formulating compelling research questions, designing robust methodologies, and critically analysing sources—skills essential to any serious historian.

The talk was followed by an engaging Q&A session, where students, faculty, and staff had the opportunity to interact directly with Dr. Daechsel and gain further insights into academic research practices.



HISTORY AS METHOD: A SESSION WITH PROF. AYESHA JALAL (20th Jan, 2025)

The Department of History and Pakistan Studies at the University of the Punjab hosted an insightful session featuring Prof. Ayesha Jalal, a renowned historian and Professor of History at Tufts University. The talk, titled "History as Method," attracted a keen audience eager to engage with one of the field's most influential scholars.





Prof. Jalal emphasized the importance of viewing history as an investigative and analytical discipline rather than a vehicle for ideological messaging. She expressed concern over the prevalence of ideology and propaganda in Pakistani historiography, noting how such tendencies have profoundly influenced the narrative of the nation-state.

"History is not just about dates, names, and events," she asserted, urging a shift toward critical inquiry. She underscored the multicultural and heterogeneous nature of Pakistan, arguing that the elevation of national myths to historical fact has contributed to a deep-seated identity crisis within the country.

Calling for the creation of alternative popular histories and a more balanced national discourse, Prof. Jalal advocated for a nuanced understanding of the past. She also highlighted the practical challenges facing historians in Pakistan, including restricted access to archives and poor archival management.

In an effort to make history more accessible and engaging, Prof. Jalal championed the integration of literature into historical narratives. She voiced concern over declining Urdu literacy among youth and stressed the need to revive studies in Persian and early modern history to broaden historical consciousness. In her view, cultivating a robust



national identity depends on fostering critical and balanced historical narratives.

The session concluded with a dynamic Q&A segment, reflecting the audience's strong engagement. Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Chairman of the Department of History, expressed heartfelt thanks to Prof. Jalal for her thought-provoking lecture and the stimulating dialogue it inspired.

This event marked another significant step in the Department's ongoing efforts to encourage meaningful academic discourse on the vital role of history in shaping national identity and progress.

THE ILLUMINATING LEGACY OF IQBAL IN THE MIDDLE EAST: A SPECIAL LECTURE (21st Jan, 2025)



A special lecture titled "Middle East Mein lqbaliyat ke Chirag" was organized by the lqbal Academy Pakistan and the Department of History and Pakistan Studies at the University of Punjab. SEMINAR ON KASHMIR DAY (4th feb, 2025)



The Department of History and Pakistan Studies at the University of the Punjab organized a thought-provoking seminar on the Kashmir issue, chaired by Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Chairman of the Department. The guest speaker, Ghazi Muhammad Abdullah, Assistant Professor, offered a compelling analysis of the complexities surrounding this longstanding conflict.

Describing Kashmir as far more than a simple territorial dispute between India and Pakistan, Mr. Abdullah highlighted its deeply rooted historical, political, and social dimensions. The issue has long served as a flashpoint in South Asia, with far-reaching implications for regional stability.

Tracing the origins of the conflict back to the 1947 partition of British India, he emphasized the critical role played by the British Empire, the controversial accession of Kashmir to India, and the series of wars and military standoffs that followed. The conflict has not only led to repeated confrontations but also triggered insurgencies and grave human rights violations, leaving lasting scars on the region.



Mr. Abdullah stressed the importance of understanding the historical context in order to fully grasp the present-day challenges. He argued that any sustainable resolution must acknowledge the aspirations and voices of the Kashmiri people.

The seminar served as a timely reminder of the urgent need for peaceful dialogue. Mr. Abdullah called for renewed diplomatic efforts between India and Pakistan, aimed at reaching a mutually acceptable solution that respects both regional stability and the will of the Kashmiri population.

VISIT OF MUSHAAL MALIK AND HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS IN KASHMIR (20TH FEB, 2025)



The Department of History and Pakistan Studies at the University of the Punjab hosted a thoughtprovoking seminar featuring Mushaal Hussein Malik, wife of prominent Kashmiri Hurriyat leader Yasin Malik. In her powerful address, she shed light on the ongoing human rights violations in Indian-occupied Kashmir and the sacrifices made by Kashmiris in their decades-long struggle for self-determination.

Mushaal Malik emphasized that the Kashmiri people are standing against India's massive military presence—claiming that without their resistance, India would have advanced towards Pakistan. She described the region as "the worst prison in the world," particularly after the Indian government's revocation of Article 370 on August 5, 2019, which she said has led to increased repression and killings.

Reflecting on the intergenerational nature of the struggle, she noted, "We are throwing our generations into the freedom movement. My mother made both her daughter and granddaughter the vanguard of this cause." She asserted that when the history of Kashmir is written, it will expose atrocities even greater than those witnessed in Palestine.

Malik reiterated that Kashmir is not just a regional issue, but a deeply rooted conflict in international law and human rights, where people have long been denied their UN-mandated right to self-determination.

Prof. Dr. Mahboob Hussain, Chairman of the Department of History, also addressed the gathering. He emphasized the academic importance of critically examining the Kashmir conflict, noting that Mushaal Malik's call to study Yasin Malik's sacrifices and the biases within the Indian judicial system had drawn the attention of students and faculty alike. He further highlighted ongoing research on Kashmir at Punjab University and the Department's continued efforts to foster informed, scholarly dialogue on this pressing issue.

Faculty members and a large number of students participated in the session, making it a meaningful contribution to the academic and national conversation on Kashmir.
