The philological tradition is one of painstaking textual analysis, often related to literary history and using a fairly traditional descriptive framework. It has been largely supplanted by modern linguistics, which

studies historical data more selectively as part of the discussion of broader issues in linguistic theory, such as the nature of language change".(15)
